Timely Recipe

ALMOND FISH CAKES

A little left-over fish combined with protein-rich almonds make these Almond Fish Cakes an excellent substitute for meat. Fry them to a golden brown and top each cake with a broiled slice of tomato to give them the final bit of good looks and good tastes.

Almond Fish Cakes

1 cup yellow corn meal
2½ cups boiling water
1 teaspoon salt
¾ cup minced cooked fish
1 egg
2 tablespoons milk
Salt
¾ cup finely chopped unblanched almonds
Oil for frying

Stir corn meal into boiling water, salted with 1 teaspoon salt. Cook and stir about 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Add fish and beat; cool. Form into 8 medium-thick cakes or croquettes. Beat egg and milk together. Dip fish cakes into egg-milk mixture, sprinkle lightly with salt and roll in chopped almonds. Fry slowly in hot oil over low heat, turning to brown all sides. Serve hot.

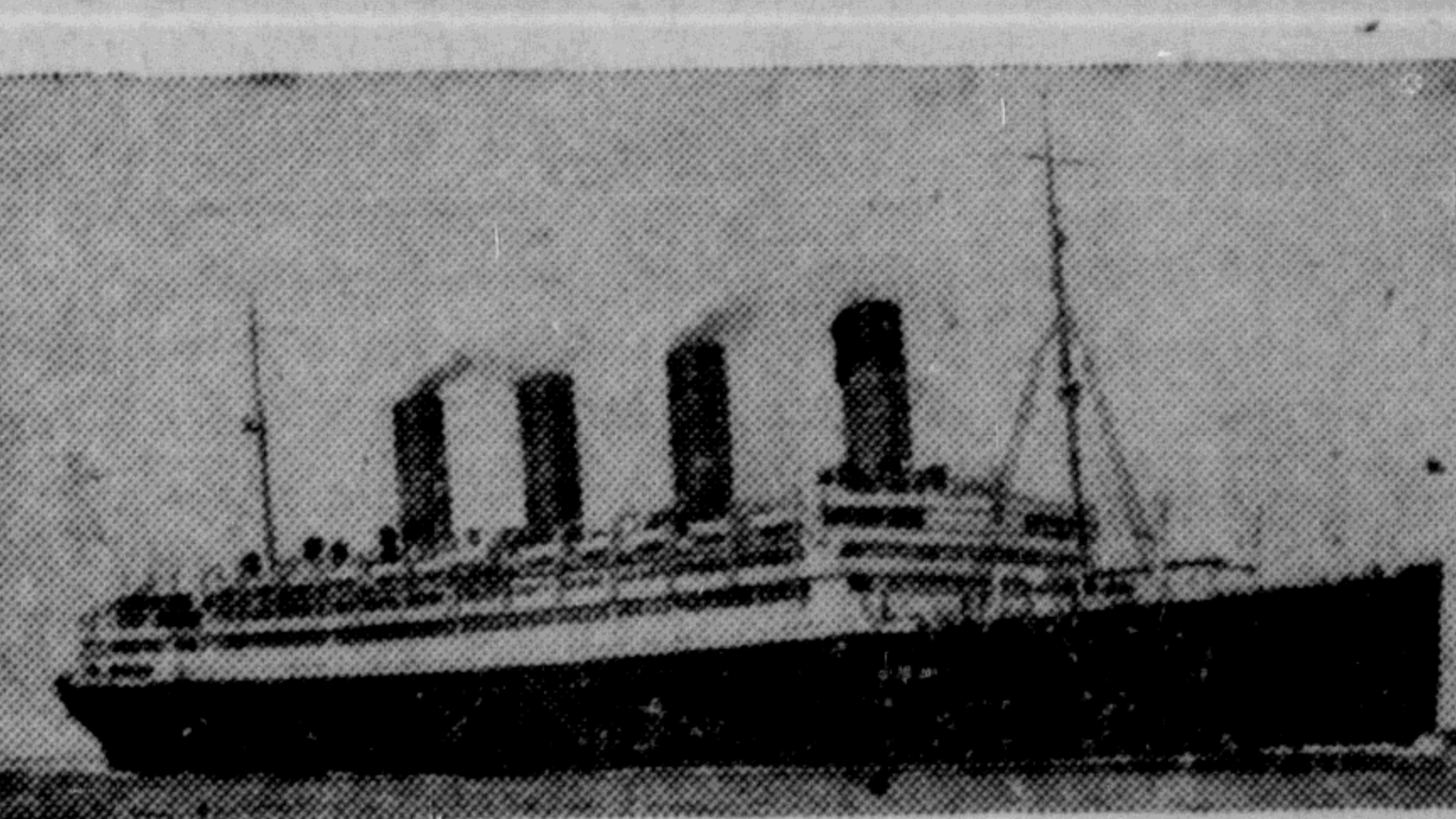
