Piano Master Heard— Schapiro Thrilling

Eminent Russian-American
Virtuoso Charms Civic Centre
Audience

First big name musical artist of the season to appear at Prince Rupert's Civic Centre came last night in the person of Maxim Schapiro, eminent Russian-American pianist, who was enthusiastically greeted and deservedly acclaimed by an appreciative audience of some 350 persons who were thrilled by an exciting exposition of his mastery. The recital was sponsored jointly by the Imperial Order, Daughters of the Empire and the Civic Centre Association, both of which are to be congratulated on their public spiritedness in promoting another outstanding contribution to the cultural amenities of the community.

Mr. Schapiro's recital encompassed a wide range of versatility couched in many moods as he rendered a two-hour program which included classics of yesterday as well as ultra-modern works. Vivid tone control and flawless perfection of technique were displayed by the artist who played in a depth of earnestness which he conveyed to his captivated listeners.

Beethoven's vigorous Sonata in C Major (Waldstein), Opus 53, was a happy opening selection and its alternating moods of sweeping stringency and quiet pensiveness gave Schapiro ample opportunity to reveal powers of control and modulation which were to be further accentuated as his program continued.

Fluency of interpretation was amply depicted in a Chopin group dedicated in commemoration of the centennial of the death of the Polish master who passed away just 100 years ago come October 18, leaving to the world his rich legacy of classical music. "Ballade in A-Flat Major Opus 47," "Berceuse Op. 57," "Tarantella, Op. 43" and "Nocturne in C Sharp Minor" led up to the intermission climax.

ax of the always popular "Polonaise in A-Flat Major, Op. 53" which has come to be known as "The Song to Remember."

Ten fanciful and readily comprehensible etudes in the ultra-modern mood by Virgil Thomson, exponent of the purely American spirit in classical music, opened the second half of the program and carried the audience into heights of imagination. Highly interpretative in nature with fanfare, madrigal, canon, aeolian harp, waltz, tango, music box, spinning song, five finger exercise and rag-time effects in swift succession, the group worked up to an ovation.

Schapiro honored his own teacher, Nicholas Metzner, by presenting two of his "Fairy Tales" in intriguing moods. Another Metzner fairy tale was to follow later for the one encore of the evening.

Ravel's "Jeau d'Eau" was smoothly executed and was followed by Villa-Lobos, "Alma Brasileira" with its odd tonal effects and abrupt culmination.

Liszt's "Tarantella, Venezia e Napoli," executed with perfect precision by the artist's flying hands, brought high entertainment to a melodious and spirited ending.

Schapiro's visit to Prince Rupert was followed by his sailing last night on the Prince George for a tour of Alaska which will include concerts at Juneau, Sitka, Fairbanks and Anchorage. Then he will play in Vancouver before proceeding on to engagements in the United States which will be followed by a tour of South America.

In the absence of the minister, Rev. Lawrence G. Sieber, who was attending a meeting of the Prince Rupert Presbytery at Bella Coola where a new church was being received into the United Church of Canada and an ordination service was being held, the pulpit of First United Church at Prince Rupert was capably filled on Sunday by P. H. Linzey in the morning and by F. E. Anfield in the evening.

Mr. Linzey spoke from the words, "More than Conquerors," and stressed the need for the church to be a militant organization. The apostle Paul was the type of Christian that the church needed. Judged by ordinary standards, Paul's life was one of adversity and defeats. But judged by the Christian standard it was a glorious triumph, for it exemplified the victory of the soul over material failures. The spiritual things are those that cannot be shaken and they enable the individual to become the victor over rather than the victim of the vicissitudes of life. Mankind must believe with the determination to have faith, that is, a matter of make use of that belief. Man must have the virile experience of the indwelling of Christ in the human race.

At the evening service Mr. Anfield spoke at length on "World Trends in Christian Missions." Mr. Anfield referred to the need for the active interest of the individual in the work of the Christian church abroad. The church that becomes an introvert is already a dying church.
