

WASHINGTON, D.C. (CP)-The House of Representatives foreign affairs committee today called for United Nations intervention in the case of Cardinal Joseph Mindszenty, sentenced to life imprisonment in Hungary for treason. The committee, calling the trial and imprisonment of the prelate, "persecu-

tion," said the case should be raised by the United States "either in the United Nations or by such other means as may be most appropriate."
