Blackwood On Bridge

By Easley Blackwood

Bridge players can be divided into three main classes. Eight per cent of them play duplicate bridge. These are the real fanatics of the game.

Twenty per cent play progressive party bridge. These players enjoy themselves but do not take their bridge too seriously.

Ninety-six per cent of all bridge players play rubber bridge. These, I think, have the most fun of all.

As you can see from these estimates many bridge players fall into more than one category.

There are a lot of things about rubber bridge play which players like my friend Mr. Masters know but have never told. I refer to a sort of higher strategy whose effectiveness often seems nothing less than uncanny to the novice.

Many times the expert player does not consciously think of these things at all. They are simply a basic part of his game and he applies them automatically. He has discovered through long experience just what course of action is most likely to show a profit in every bridge situation, with every type of partner and opponent.

The "skills" I refer to have nothing to do with the technique or the mechanics of bridge. They have to do with the HUMANICS. As Mr. Masters says: "Look at the people first—then look at the cards."

The temperaments and the abilities of the players are the most important things to consider in rubber bridge. I will give you a series of articles on how to handle your partners—and your opponents as well. You can learn all the rules of bidding and play but unless you know your bridge HUMANICS you can never be a really expert player.

Don't let that word HUMANICS scare you off. It's just a short way of saying "a consideration of the human elements in bridge." Most of the principles to be outlined are simple and easy to learn. You may wonder why you haven't thought of them and applied them before.
