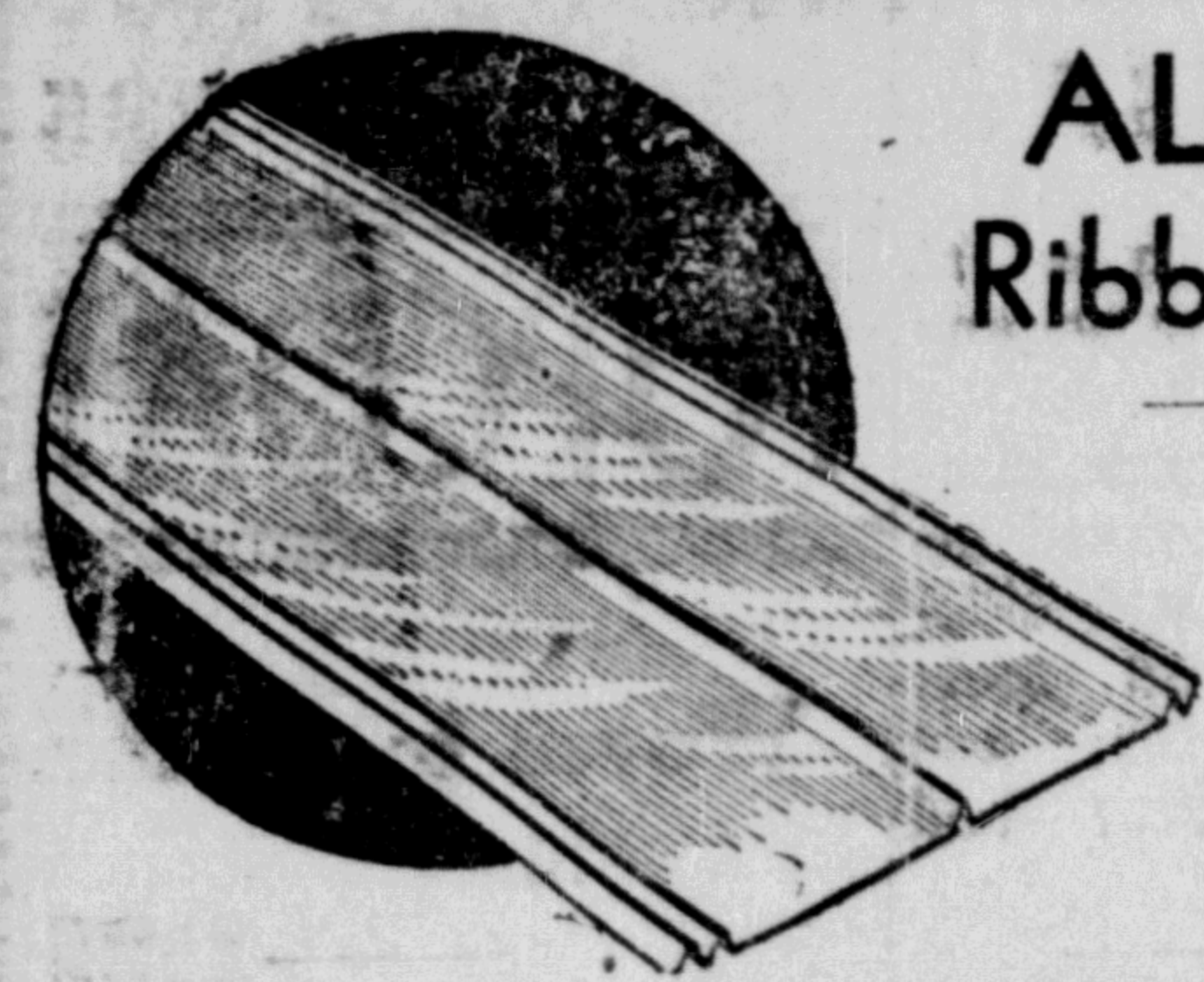

### Swim Ass'n Wants Some Money Back

VANCOUVER—British Columbia Amateur Swimming Association is threatening to sue the Canadian Olympic Games Committee unless it returns money which it claims was sent from here just before the swimming team left Canada for the recent Olympic Games in London. Percy Norman of Vancouver said that the British Columbia Association was filing formal application to the Canadian committee to have "about three hundred dollars" returned.

### Three Years Champ Limit

Championship teams seem to play at their best for a period of about three years. After that they start to slip. The urge to win somehow is not so strong.

Take for example the New York Yankees in baseball. In the years of 1941-32 there was nothing to stop them as they won the American League pennant.

In 1944, however, the rot set in and they finished third. Then there was the Philadelphia Athletics. They took the bunting in 1929-30-31, but wound up second in 1932.

Over in the National loop, the Cardinals won in 1942-43-44. But the following year they had to be content with second spot. Then there is the situation in modern-day hockey, where "super" teams fall apart even sooner.

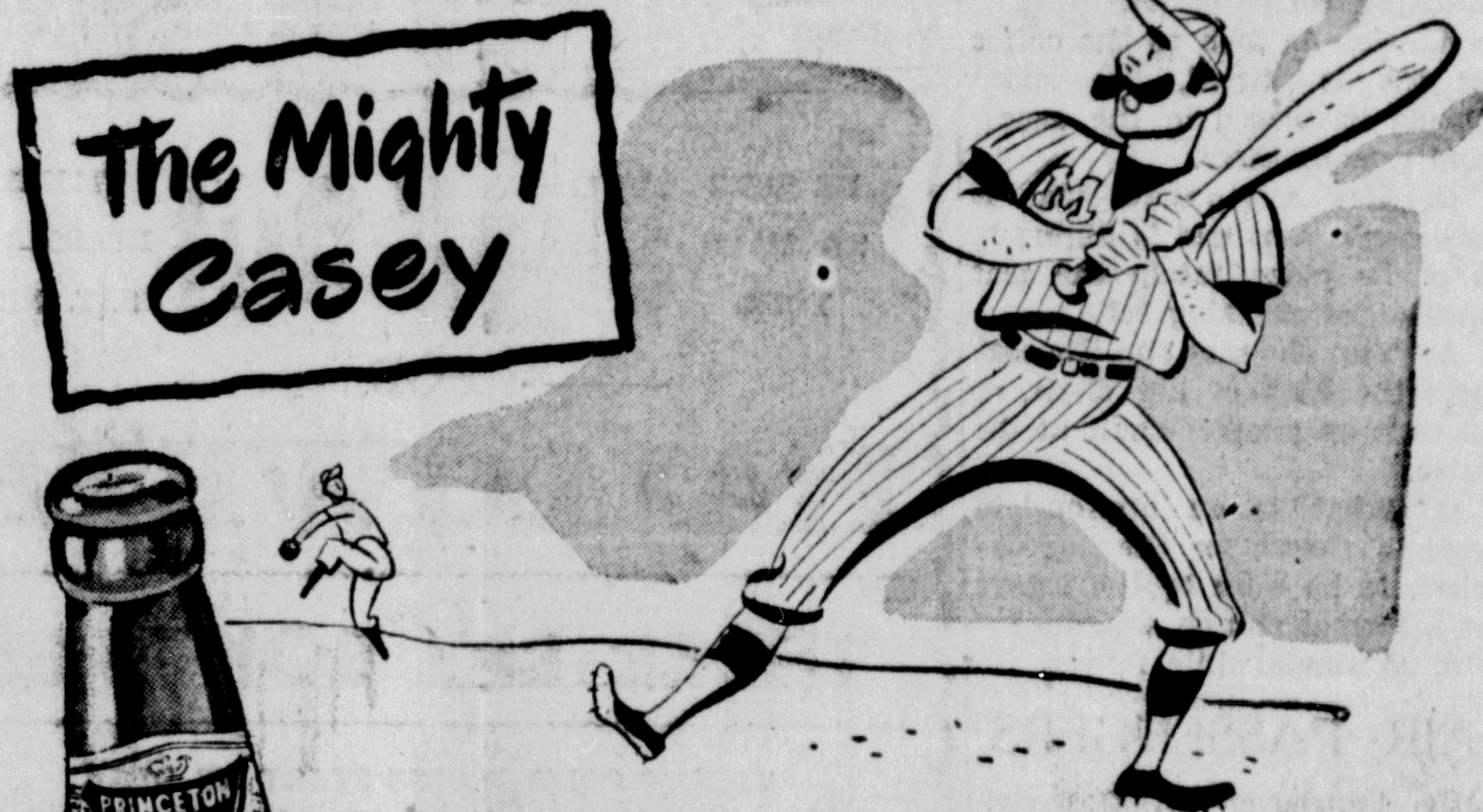
