In 1948 the value of Canada's field crops set an all-time record of \$1,595,000,000.

Since Canada's first National Park was created at Banff in 1885 the system has grown to include 26 parks with an area of over 29,660 square miles. It stretches from the Selkirk Mountains in British Columbia to the east coast of Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia.

There are 1,025 miles in Canada producing livestock feed; 918 of them are in Ontario and Quebec.

Westminster Hoopsters Coming Here

The Duke of Connaught High School basketball squad from New Westminster will play a two game series with the local Bo-Me-Hi Rainmakers on February 23 and 24. The Dukes have an amazing record with 23 wins in 25 games played. In competition with American schools they have 8 victories against 2 defeats. They are recognized as the leading high school basketball team on the lower mainland.

The travelling team consists of eight players: Bob Flynn, Danny Zaharko, Steve Sviatko, Paul Breday, Jack Kennisa, Sid Burrows, Grover Sinclair and Hugh Sinclair, along with manager Sonny Nelson and coach Ken Wright. The five players mentioned will probably be the Purple and Gold's starting line-up.

No one player is outstanding and all the scoring is fairly evenly distributed.

The Dukes are a tall team and all their players are 6 feet or over with the exception of two. Their average height is about 6 feet, 1 inch. When they visited Rupert two years ago, the Dukes managed to defeat the Rainmakers both games but this year the fans think that it will be a different story.
