**DANGER OF WIRES**—4,500-volt wires imperilled the lives and hampered the fight of Quebec City firemen to subdue a \$500,000 fire which destroyed the Mountain Hill Hotel, in which three lives were lost. "Very dangerous," said Fire Chief Rosaire Beaulieu of the ice-encrusted wires, shown here. "We couldn't get near the fire because of these wires until the current was cut off. Firemen are always in danger and their work is made harder as a result of overhead power lines." Chief Beaulieu and other Canadian fire chiefs have long urged removal of poles and wires to end a grave menace to public safety.
