In shrubbery, for instance, the succession can start (where it is hardly enough) with the Forsythia, which flowers almost as soon as the snow goes, and end with the Buddelia, or Butter Fly bush which blooms in September and October. With flowers the fall planted bulbs will be the first to brighten the garden and the spring planted bulbs - chrysanthemums, and other annuals and perennials,


