September Fair Month

Prince Rupert had a fair month of September from the weather standpoint. There was 6.43 inches of rain on eighteen days while the sun shone for 89.2 hours on fifteen days. The rainfall was less and the sunshine more, than a year ago.

So far this year there has been precipitation to the extent of 58.82 inches here compared with 59.21 inches in the first nine months of 1949.

The sunshine this year to date aggregates 803.6 hours compared with 768.2 hours in the corresponding period last year.

The weather summary for September was as follows: Maximum temperature, 70 on September 21. Minimum temperature, 41 on September 29 and 30. Precipitation, 6.43 inches on eighteen days. Sunshine, 99.2 hours on fifteen days. Maximum barometer at sea level, 30.55 on September 28. Minimum temperature, 29.52 on September 23. Mean temperature, 53.1. Maximum wind velocity, southeast, 27 miles per hour, September 23.

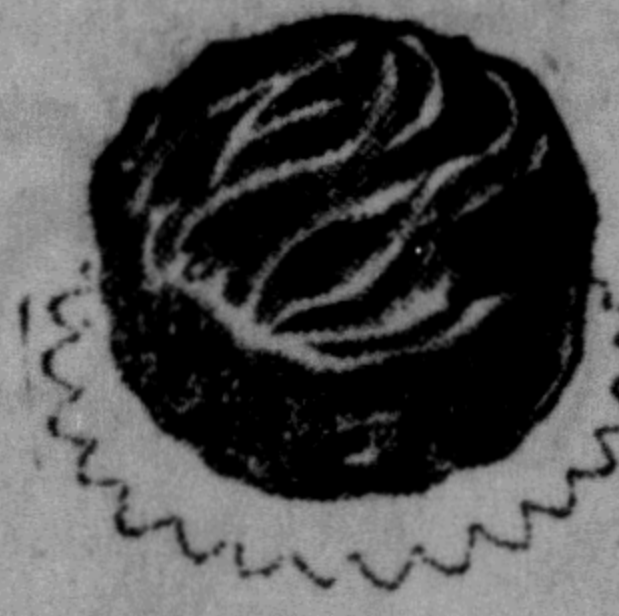
