

RADIOPHONE TO MILLER BAY

An emergency radio-telephone installation today was set up at the Miller Bay Hospital, five miles from Prince Rupert, to relieve a situation caused by the failure of the telephone land lines between the city and the hospital.

Since the lines went out two weeks ago, the 150-bed hospital has been without telephonic communication. The lead-in cable line has been causing trouble for some time.

According to Dr. J. D. Galbraith, director of the hospital, exposed copper lines will be strung to replace the faulty cables.

Communications to the hospital on the radio-telephone hook-up will be routed through the city telephone exchange.

Value of building construction in Prince Rupert in 1948 was the lowest since 1939, according to figures provided by the City Engineer's office. Total last year was \$193,123, the first time it has dropped below the \$200,000 level since the first year of the war.

In 1947 the total was \$210,340 and in 1946, \$230,980.

Value of building permits issued in December was \$12,235, composed of 15 permits, only one of which was for more than \$1,000. That was a permit authorizing construction of a residence for Chris Parkvold on Athl Avenue valued at \$9,000.
