To Report On Game Meeting

Jarvis H. McLeod, who returned to the city recently after attending a British Columbia game convention in Vancouver as zone representative for Northern B.C., reports a busy session with controversial issues concerning the entire province. Chief difficulties encountered by the Game Department, as revealed by Game Commissioner Cunningham, were a reduced appropriation from the government and a shortage of biologists for research work.

Mr. McLeod, who represented game clubs of Ocean Falls, Queen Charlotte Islands and Terrace as well as the Prince Rupert organization, will deliver a report to the local club Tuesday evening.

District Firemen Having Refresher

A travelling unit of the provincial fire marshals' office is in the city giving a refresher course to the local department and company brigades of the district.

Yesterday's instruction included the following points: ladders, organization, a chemistry of fire film, knots, ventilation, forcible entry and salvage.

Today's topics are inspections, hose, a film, rescue, first aid, gas masks and fire gasses.

Under study tomorrow will be local inspections, first aid fire fighting, appliances, inspection, investigation and a film followed by a concluding forum.

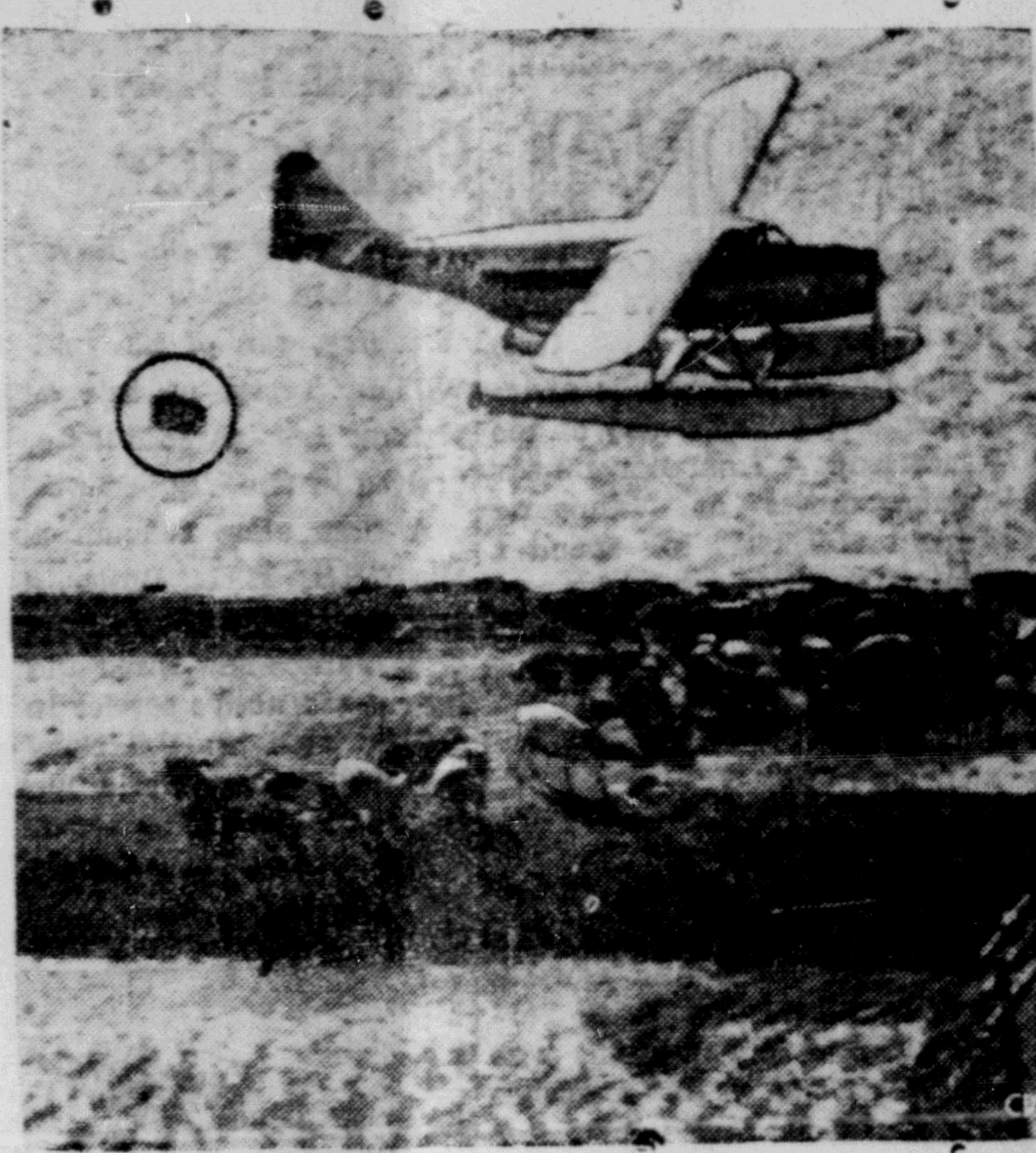
