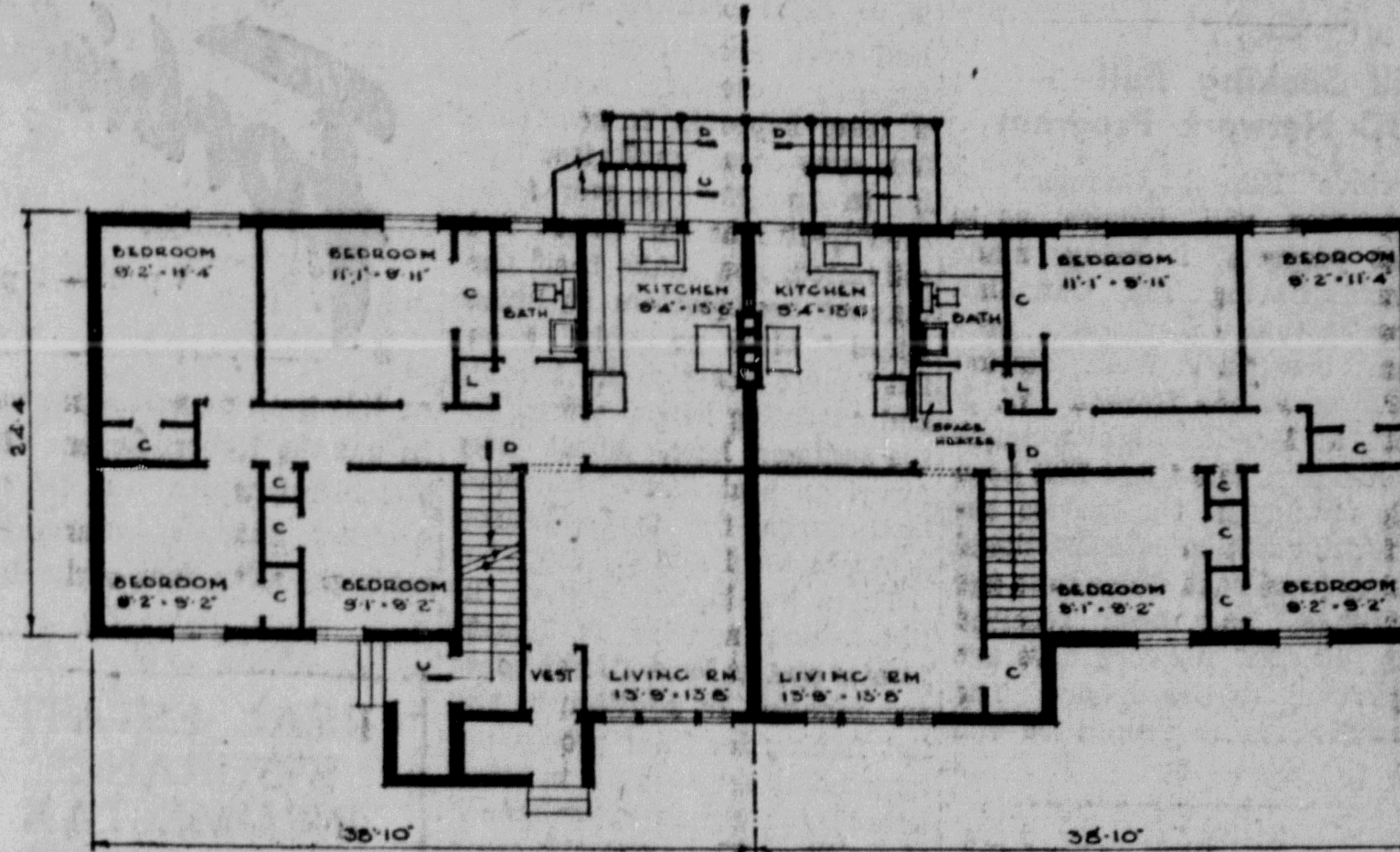
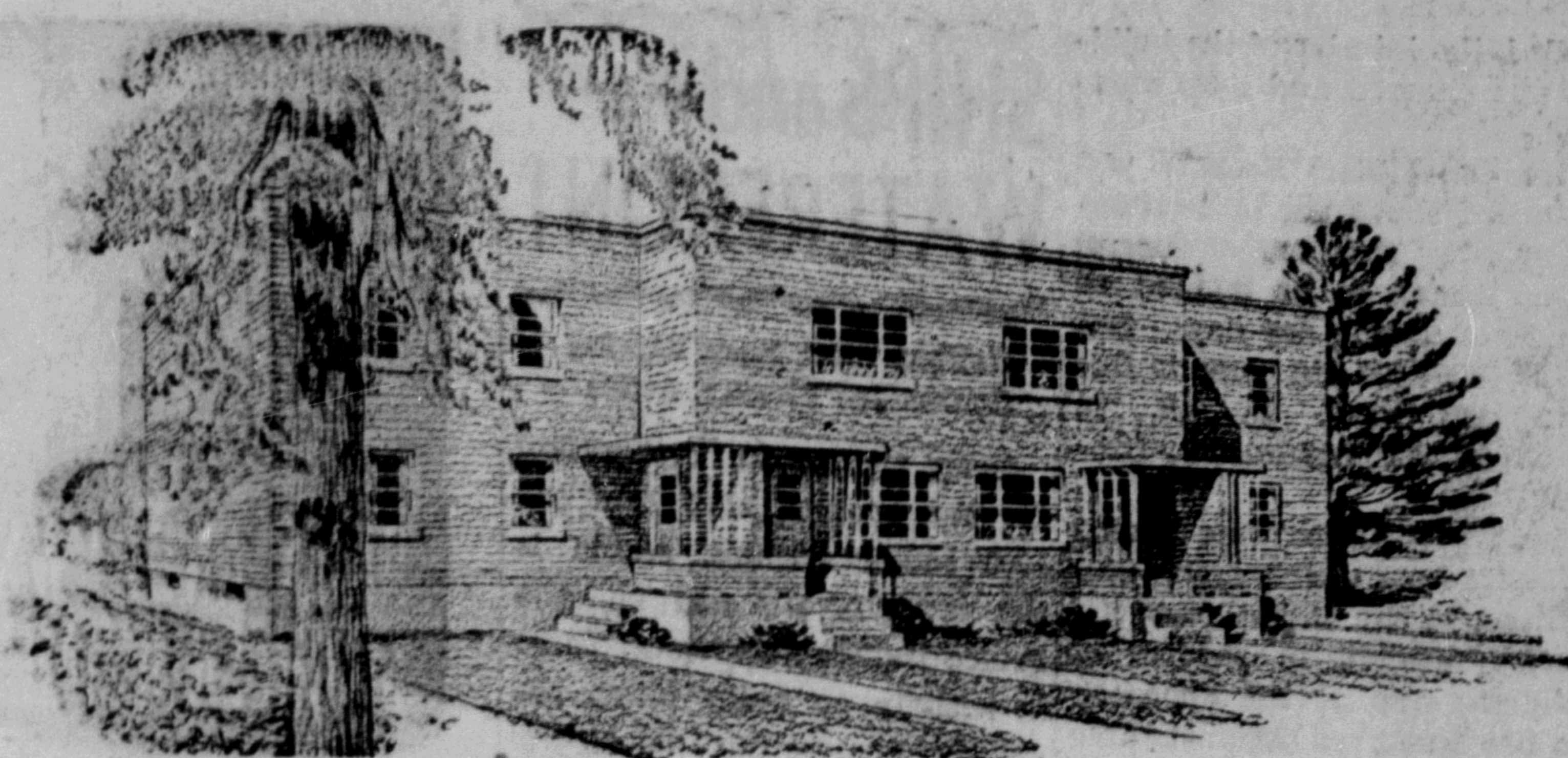

Timely Recipes

SALMON TURNOVERS

1/2 lb. can salmon
1/2 tsp. cornstarch
1/2 cup milk
1 hard cooked egg
1 tbsp. butter
pastry

Chop fine the Salmon and hard cooked egg. Stir moistened cornstarch in milk over slow fire. When thickened, beat in Salmon, butter and seasoning to taste. Cool. Make a rich pie crust, and cut the turnovers with a saucer upside down. Wet edges with cold water. Put a good tablespoon of Salmon mixture on half of crust, fold over other half and press well together. Cut small slits on top, brush with milk and bake in quick oven. Serves 4.

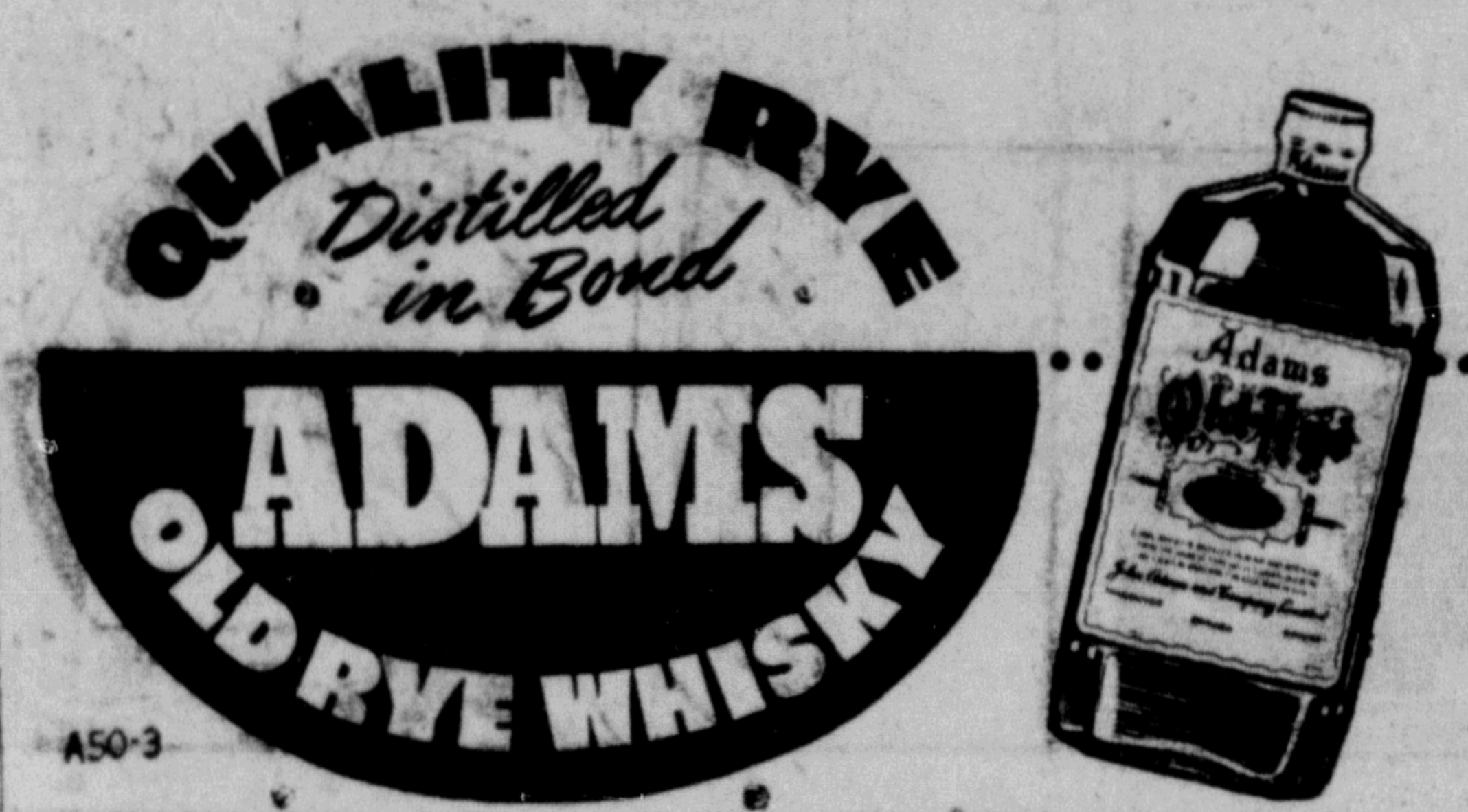
