and dwarfed children she remembered from her younger days in England. The sixpence meal at school was doing a good job with the children.  
At about eleven years of age, children were subjected to a selective examination to find whether or not they should proceed further in school. Only a few were allowed to proceed to a secondary education and to university. It caused a great deal of anxiety on the part of parents she said, and caused injustices in some cases where children had had setbacks in early life. But she would give no guesses as to the final outcome of the plan, which was started during the war.  
Mrs. Arnold said there did not seem to be a great deal of excitement about the Korean war. People had a resigned attitude toward it but believed something had to be done to halt armed aggression.  
The poor condition of rolling stock on the railroads and the difficulties in getting assistance in the stations struck her. Equally noticeable was the comfort of long distance motor coaches. Most of the tiny automobiles were old. Hotel accommodation was unobtainable, she said, except in inferior establishments where rates were high and services and amenities at a minimum.  
She referred to bomb damage, particularly in Coventry, where one saw on the outskirts single tiles replaced and going into the city these increased to larger patches and finally to groups of buildings destroyed and in the centre everything destroyed. The cathedral was gone with the exception of the spire. She said she had been told the spire clock had kept chiming out the time all during the fateful night of the bombing. A sanctuary had been rebuilt from stone from the wall and a cross fashioned from two fallen timbers.
