## REGULATION LOADS AND SPEEDS

On all Roads in the Skeena Electoral District

The undersigned, being a person authorized by the Minister of Public Works to exercise the powers invested in the said Minister in Part 2 of the "Highway Act" and being of the opinion that the above roads are liable to damage through extraordinary heavy traffic thereon, hereby make the following regulations, pursuant to Section 35 of the said Act.

The following loads and speeds indicated will be imposed by notice restricting traffic posted on the roads as and when required.

Trucks—Loaded or Unloaded—Prohibited except between the hours of midnight and 10 a.m. and then only if the roads are in a thoroughly frozen condition.

Passenger Vehicles—Limited to four passengers exclusive of driver. Maximum gross load not to exceed two tons.

Speed Limit—20 miles per hour for all vehicles.
