Fastball Upset

Co-op, which has been trailing somewhat in the city fastball league, reached back three weeks into the past Saturday night to submerge the top-dog 99 Taxi team by a score of 11-4 in a league fixture which had been postponed from June 5.

Despite the setback the taximen are still at the top of the heap with four wins and one loss while Co-op has moved into a tie with C.N.R.A. for third place with two wins and two losses. The fishermen showed clear-cut strength from the start when they clouted Taxi pitcher Pilford for two runs in the first inning and three in the third. Pilford was then replaced by Bekak who carried through until the ninth. However, although he lasted only a little more than two innings on the mound, Pilford was marked as the losing pitcher by the scorers.

Cy Kellett, who went the course for C.N.R.A., faced 38 batters, allowed 11 hits, struck out four and walked three. Pilford allowed two hits and walked five in his brief time on the rubber. Although Bekak cleared up the dangerous situation which developed in the fifth to allow three walks, two of which scored. In the eighth, the railwaymen got into him again, scoring their final four runs off four hits.

Heaviest batting of the game was performed by Pierce, Taxi third baseman, who got four hits in five times at bat, one of them a double. Kellett allowed the taximen one hit in each of the first five innings but close fielding by Co-op kept the scoreboard clear until the sixth. Then Rosedale knocked a two-bagger and was brought home on a single by Gurvich. Taxi scored two more in the eighth when A. Hartwig got on base on an error by Smith and Gurvich singled. Pierce brought in the final run in the ninth off a single.

HOTELMEN OVERTAKE MOOSE

SIXTH INNING BREAKAWAY DECIDES BASEBALL GAME

Savoys 11, Moose 4

A sixth inning breakaway, by Savoys, which netted them eight runs, brought the league-leading hotelmen up from behind the hard-working Moose and gave them an 11 to 4 victory in Sunday's city league baseball fixture at Roosevelt Park.

It was a caricature of the routine which has seen Moose defeated in all but one of the nine games they have played this season. Either the lodge brothers start strong and then let the opposition get away on them or they open slowly and make a belated victory drive that is too late to be of any use. The early part of the game saw a good brand of baseball with Savoy taking three runs in the first inning, and Moose taking one in the first, two in the second and one in the third. Moose's 4-3 advantage lasted until the fateful sixth. In the succeeding six innings, they made only three hits.

That sixth inning saw Savoys clout six hits, with two others scoring off fielders' errors. Arney and Minor Simundson got on base on singles and were brought home by Jack Sharpe off a single. Morgan singled and came home on a hit by Gurvich. Sharpe and Gurvich were brought home by Alex Bill, who in turn, made the circuit after hitting a single.

Following this debacle, Moose pitcher Forbes was replaced by Benny Windle, who up to that time had been on the other end of the battery. Hitchens was called in from centre field to catch.

Benny held the hotelmen down to four hits in the final two innings, facing 10 batters. In the six earlier innings, Forbes faced 30 men, striking out two, allowing 11 hits and two bases on balls.

Savoy pitcher Jack Sharpe faced 35 men in nine innings, striking out four, allowing seven hits and six bases on balls.

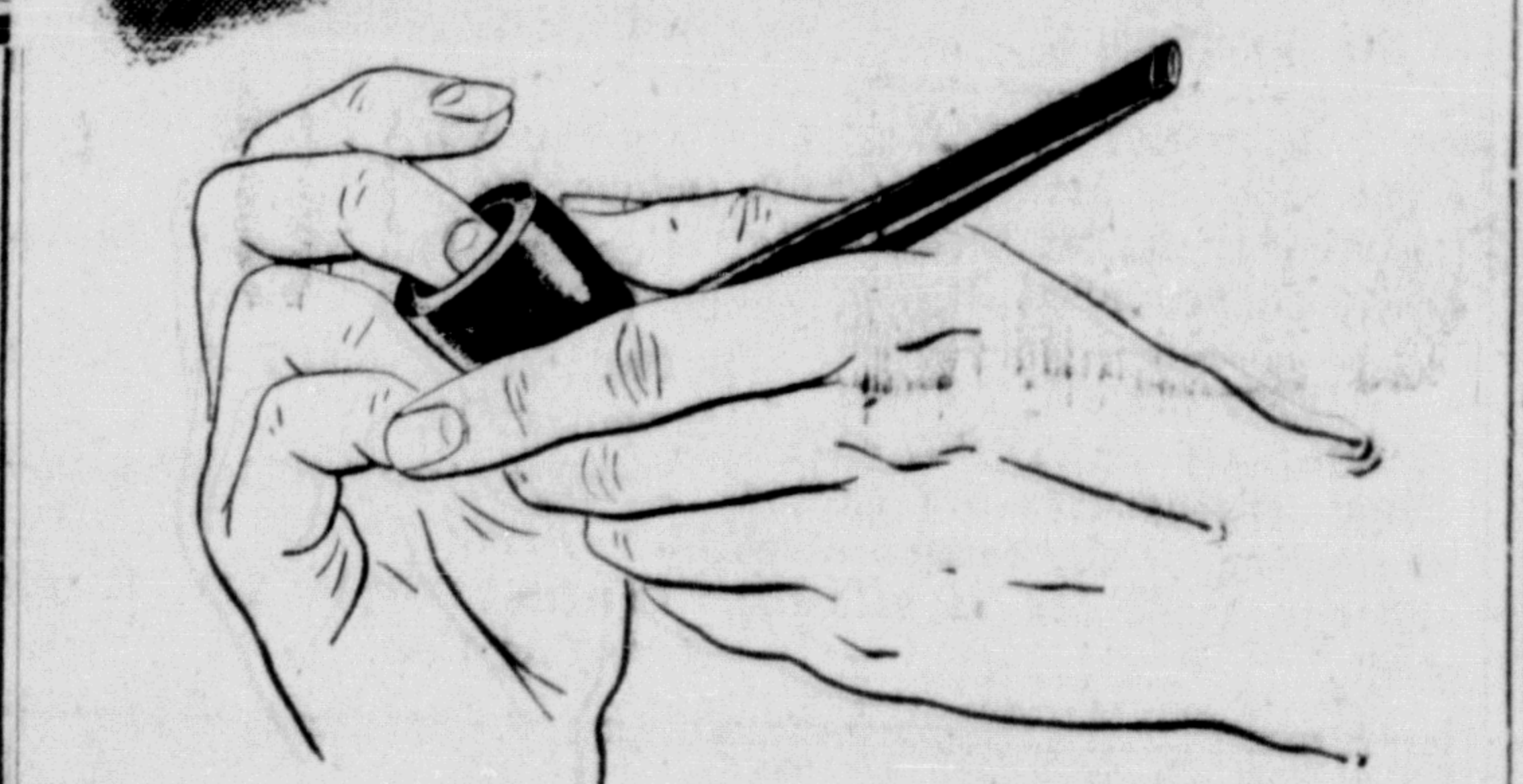
