Although this Colonial type house is not large, it's simplicity of line creates a dignified appearance. It is meant for a wide lot, with its wide frontage and fairly narrow depth. The perspective shows the exterior wall finish as brick veneer but the dimensions of the working drawings are so arranged that the house may be built of frame, brick veneer or solid masonry. The exterior dimensions are 30'10" x 18'8" and the total floor area for estimating purposes is 1,152 square feet.
