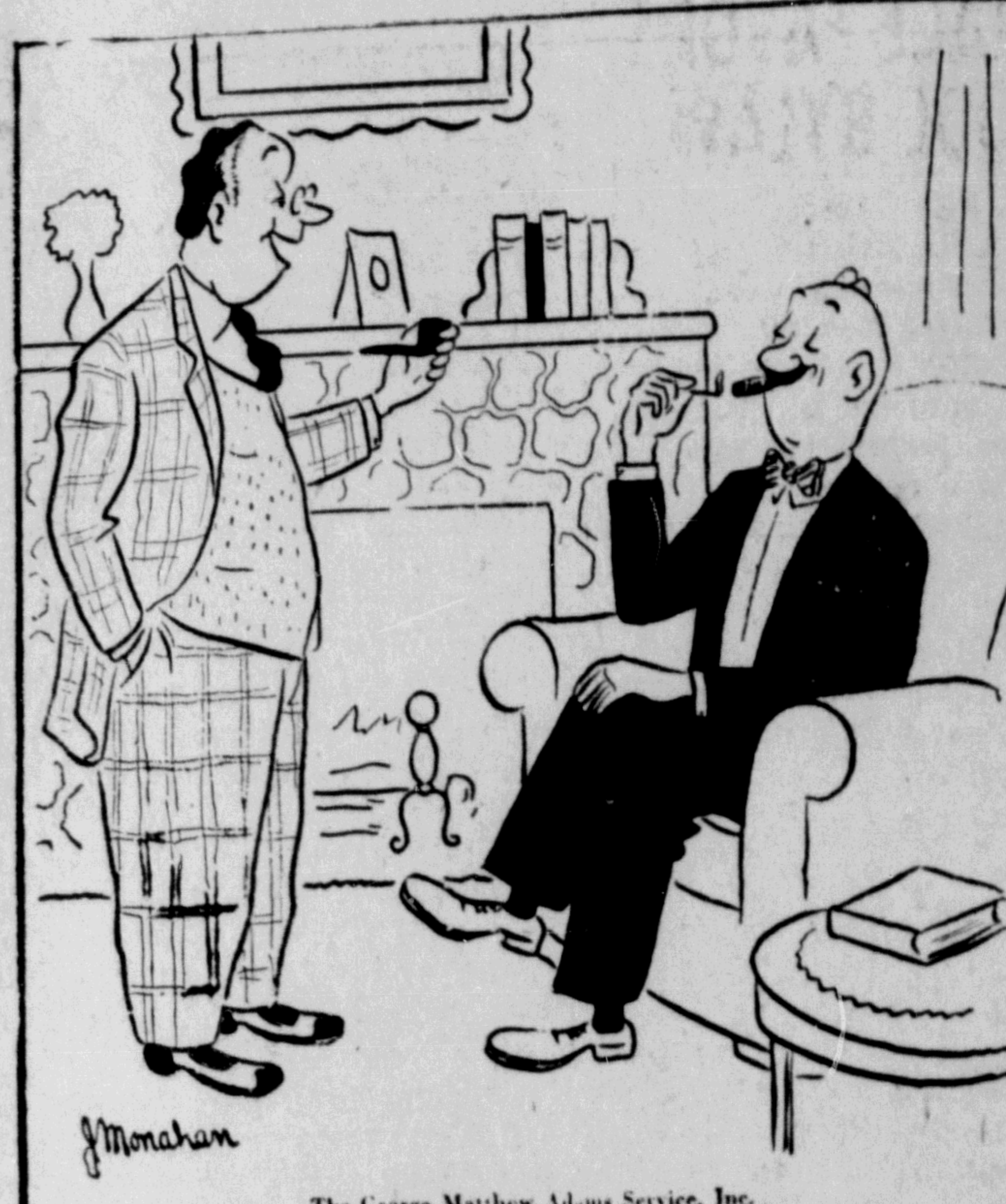

Beaver Affecting Irrigation Water

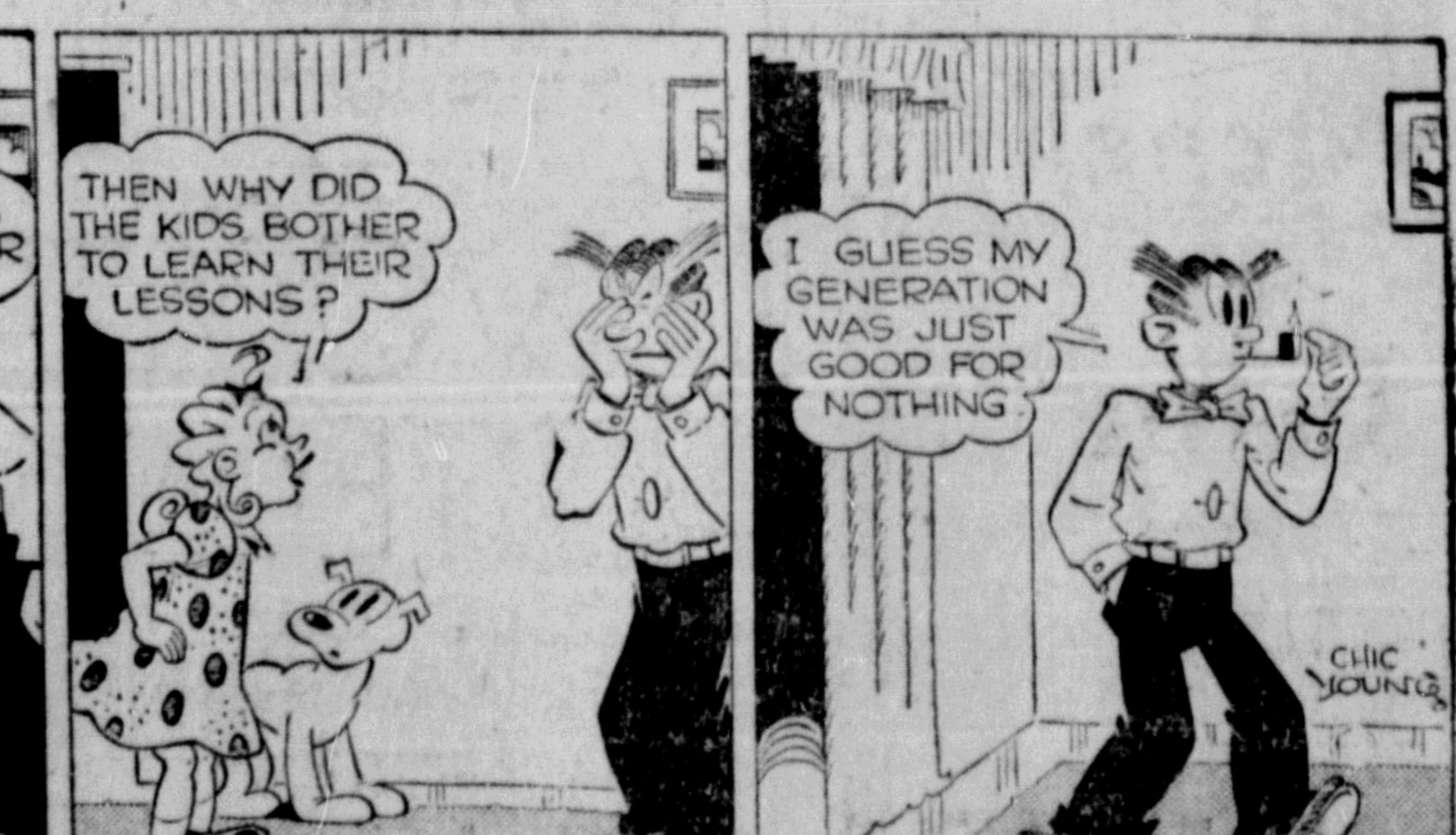
