




## Announcement

Under "Ships and Waterfront" heading in a recent article it was stated longshoremen threatened to refuse to handle cargo in this port. This was vigorously denied by longshoremen and a correction was made in the follow-

ing night's edition. Due to no co-operation from Frank Waterhouse and Co. of Canada Ltd., which is the only company now bringing in cargo to this port from the south. longsohremen are refusing to work these ships.

For some time now the longshoremen have been wanting to get a contract with Waterhouse but without results. Turning to recent events, the s.s. Chilliwack was in port last Saturday. A gang of four men was ordered to work the cargo. These men were worked for five hours—then discharged. The following morning - Sunday - the s.s. Chilliwack docked again. The crew men of the boat worked all morning unloading the rest of the cargo.

This has been a common practice of Waterhouse. The longshoremen's union wish to make it clear to the public that we do not wish to refuse to handle ·longshore work in this port. But owing to the above conditions we have no alternative until we receive a contract.
