> OTTAWA (D-Canadian delegates now touring England on their way to the Associated Countrywomen of the World convention in Copenhagen, Sept. 9-18, hope to bring the 1952 convention back to Canada where the organization was first developed.

The Ontario Agricultural Col-' lege already has been reserved for this conference in anticipation of acceptance of the Canadian invitation.

More than 42 women representing every province are making the tour. In Denmark they will meet with hundreds of other delegates from the 6,000,000member organization for the sixth triennial conference.

The A.C.W.w. grew out of the Federated Women's Institutes founded by Mrs. Adelaide Hood-1897. Since then the organization has spread all over the
