World Women May Meet In Canada

OTTAWA — Canadian delegates now touring England on their way to the Associated Countrywomen of the World convention in Copenhagen, Sept. 9-18, hope to bring the 1952 convention back to Canada where the organization was first developed.

The Ontario Agricultural College already has been reserved for this conference in anticipation of acceptance of the Canadian invitation.

More than 42 women representing every province are making the tour. In Denmark they will meet with hundreds of other delegates from the 6,600,000-member organization for the sixth triennial conference.

The A.C.W.W. grew out of the Federated Women's Institutes founded by Mrs. Adelaide Hoodless in Stoney Creek, Ont., in 1897. Since then the organization has spread all over the world.

Prime Minister St. Laurent said at a ceremony honoring Mrs. Hoodless recently: "The rapidity with which the institute movement spread is an indication of its soundness and the need which it filled."

This year's European tour will take the delegates through England, Scotland, Norway, Sweden and Denmark, Belgium and France. Most of the delegates are expected to be back in Canada Oct. 9.

While in England many of the party will accept the invitation of Lady Tweedsmuir, wife of a former Governor-General of Canada, to visit her home.

During the Scandinavian portion of the tour most of the delegates will be quartered in private homes.

"Old World" Island Expands Social Aid

ST. PIERRE, Q.—This little island, last remnant of the great French Empire in North America, is old world in lots of ways, but in social services it is well to the fore.

Family allowances in Canada are meagre compared with the system in use here. The allowances are based on the number of children in a family on a ratio with the salary of the head of the family. Under the scheme a man with four children gets an amount in family allowances equal to his own salary. That is a man earning \$100 a month gets another \$100 in family allowances.

Now an expansion of social services is being carried out. New legislation is being drawn up which will provide generous pensions for the aged and infirm in the islands of St. Pierre and

Miquelon. Other allowances will be provided for widows, orphans and crippled persons.

All these new pensions will be paid out of taxes levied in St. Pierre and Miquelon and from grants in aid from the French government.

Another new development in the social services here is the construction of a new, modern hospital under the supervision of the French government. It is being built through a grant from France, and will be maintained by further annual grants. When it is completed the present hospital will be turned into a home for the aged and infirm.
