Council Is Dissatisfied

In a question and answer period at last night's meeting of the city council, Ald. T. B. Black called attention to the council of items appearing in the local press by the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce and the provincial Department of Public Works dealing with the condition of the road between the city limits and Galloway Rapids Bridge.

Ald. Black said transportation companies were caused countless additional expense through the condition of that piece of road. He said he was more inclined to agree with the Chamber's statement about impassability of the read rather than with the provincial department denying it. He suggested the department be asked to look into the question with the idea of bringing about improvements.

A motion asking the investigation be carried out passed unanimously. The investigation will include the stretch a mile beyond the bridge.
