Ray Reflects and Reminisces

Another of the Klondike's originals has hit the long, long trail. Hartley C. Myrick, sr., aged 65, the "Kid that handled the music box in the Malamute saloon," died last week in a Seattle hospital, following a long illness. He became a sardonic at 13 and played the first piano ever seen in Skagway. He did his part in contributing to the general joyousness when "a bunch of the boys were whooping it up," with Bob Service and Dan McGrew doing the rest. The name "Ragtime Kid" stuck to Myrick for the rest of his life.

Manitoba Gets Over \$9,000

The report of the Manitoba Flood Relief Campaign presented by secretary-treasurer H. D. Thain at last night's meeting of city council showed that funds in excess of \$9,000 had been donated by citizens of Prince Rupert toward the campaign.

The citizens' committee had collected \$5,718.55. An additional sum of at least \$2,760.45 had been remitted by the banks either through their own campaigns or that of The Daily News. The latter figure is not complete as some remittances had been made before they were recorded. In addition there had been remitted by means other than through the local banks a total of \$509.

Ald. H. F. Glassey, seconded by Ald. T. B. Black moved a tribute to the secretary-treasurer and his assistants for their work and also canvassers and contributors for making the campaign a success, and an order for a card of thanks to that effect be placed in The Daily News.

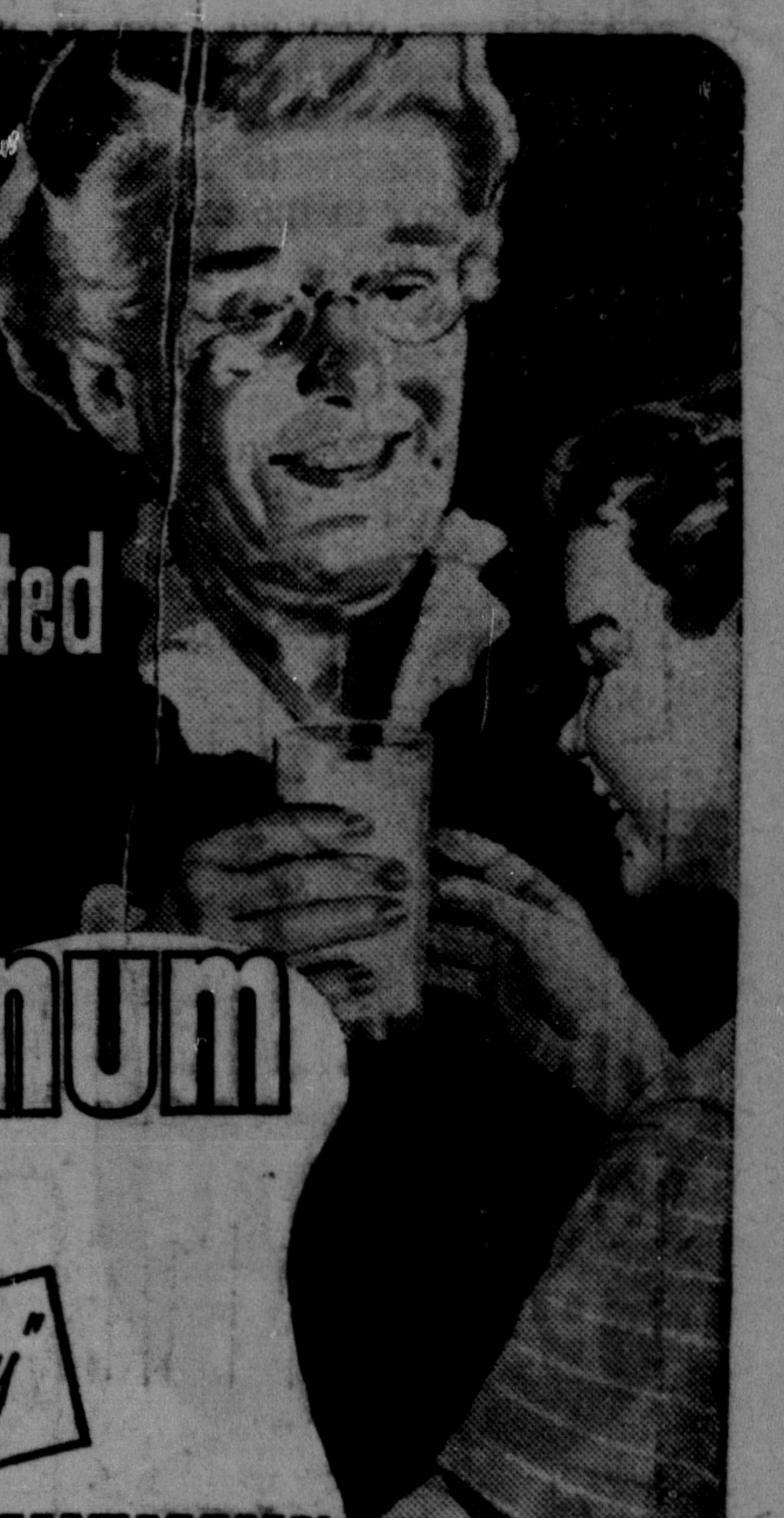
