## N. SHERWOOD OF TERRACE DIES

Highly Esteemed Pioneer Resident of Interior Town Passes in Vancouver

Nigel Sherwood, for many years clerk of the village municipality of Terrace and a well known resident of Prince Rupert district for nearly four decades, passed away at 1:30 yesterday afternoon in Shaughnessy Military Hospital at Vancouver.

Mr. Sherwood was forced to retire from active duties in November last year on account of ill-health and had been a patient in the Smithers Hospital for several weeks Two weeks ago he was taken to Vancouver for surgical treatment. However, his condition became gradually worse until he expired.

He is survived by his widow and daughter, Mrs. Victor Giraud, who were in Vancouver with him at the end. The son-in-law, Victor Giraud, arrived in the city from Terrace on last night's train and enplaned today for Vancouver where the funeral will take place.

Born in Birmingham, England, 71 years ago, Mr. Sherwood was one of a large family. On his mother's side he had famous relatives such as Rudyard Kipling and Earl Baldwin. There is one brother, Walter Sherwood, in the United States.

Working for a time in the Bank of England, Mr. Sherwood emigrated to Canada as a young man and settled at Massett some time before World War I. He was a teacher and lay reader there in the early days for the Anglican Church.

On the outbreak of World War I he enlisted and went overseas, serving with the 102nd Battalion. After the war he returned to Canada with his bride and their young daughter. In 1921 they took up residence at Terrace on Braun's Island, later moving to the present home "Sunnydene," on the banks of the Skeena River which Mr. Sherwood developed into one of the garden spots of the community.

Always taking a great interest in public affairs, Mr. Sherwood was clerk of the village of Terrace from 1931 until November 1947 when the state of his health necessitated retirement.
