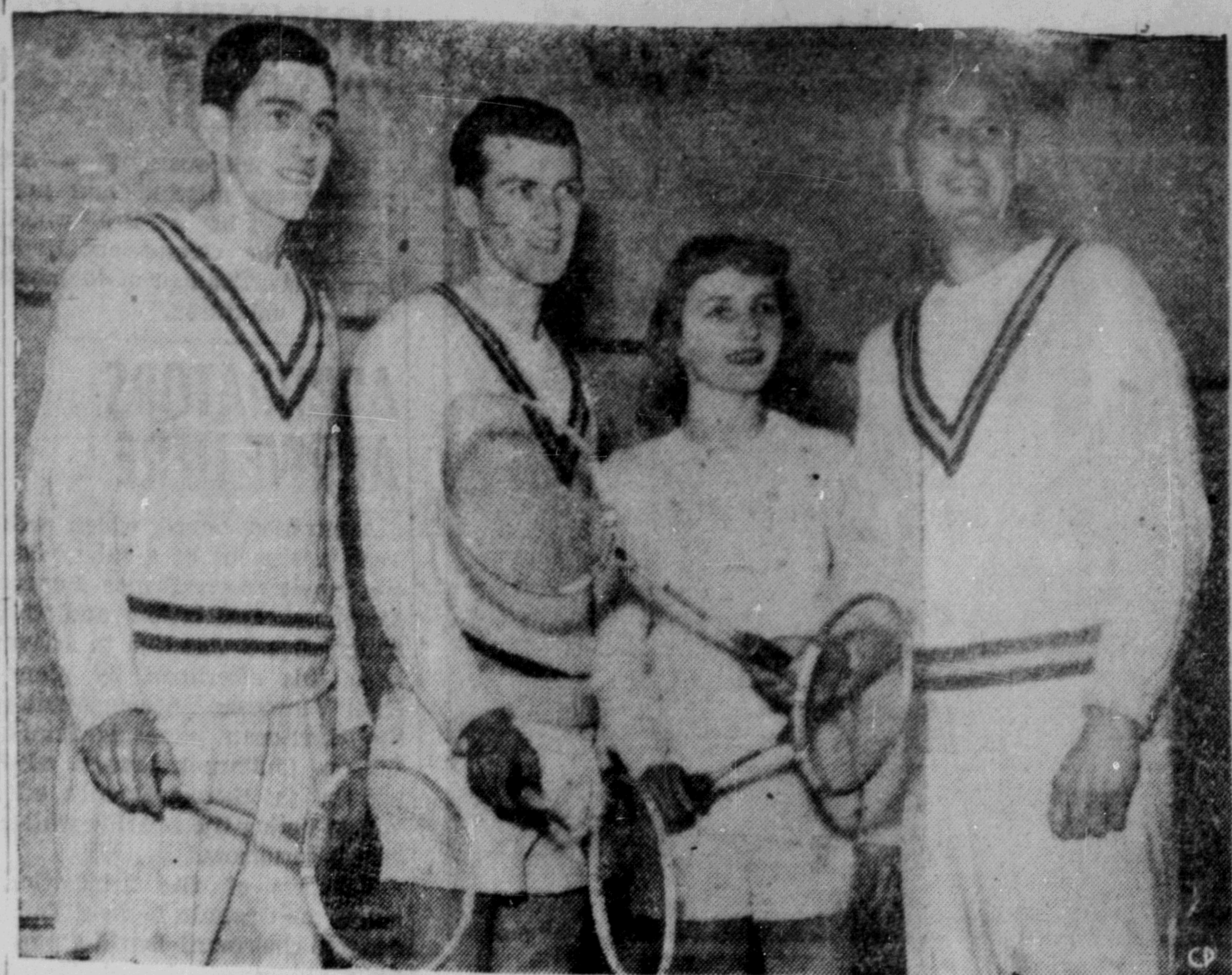

NEW JANUARY BUILDING LIGHT

Total of \$8,900 Value for Past Month

Building permits totalling \$8,900 issued by the City Engineer's office during January were the highest for any corresponding month of any year since 1946. The total exceeded that of January, 1948 by \$1,000 and January, 1947 by almost \$5,000.

Practically all of the January total gave authorization to repairs and additions to existing structures, with only a negligible amount of new building listed. Largest permit was for \$4,000, issued to the provincial Department of Public Works, for an addition to a building on First Avenue East.

JANUARY FIRE DAMAGE HIGHER

A boat fire at Cow Bay on January 14 gave Prince Rupert its greatest single fire loss in the last year. Damage from a blaze aboard the 45-foot seine boat Ka-wha-las was estimated at \$2,000 and was the greatest single loss since the Three Sisters Cafe fire last February.

City fire department answered seven calls during January, six of them resulting in negligible loss. There were five calls in January 1948 and 11 in December.

During January the city firemen acting as ambulance crew, answered 31 ambulance calls.
