Timely Recipe

BRAISED VEAL AND NOODLES

1/2 lb. salt pork, finely diced
1 1/2 lbs. veal breast, cut in 1 1/2-
inch pieces
2 tablespoons flour
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 cups water
3/4 cup diced celery
2 tablespoons chopped onion
1 1/2 cups broken noodles
1 tablespoon chopped parsley
Fry the salt pork in a heavy
pan until golden brown and
crisp. Add veal which has been
sprinkled with flour, and brown.
Add salt and water and simmer
until tender. Add celery, chopped
onion and noodles. Cover and
cook until noodles are tender.
Serve, sprinkled with chopped
parsley. Yield: 6 servings.
