In addition to the moose carcass, Mr. Van der sluis brought back a mountain sheep and sundry ducks, geese and grouse which he bagged in the country around Wistaria.

This year, Mr. Van der sluis reported, has been one of the best he has seen for willow grouse. So plentiful are they that the bag limit can be shot in a very short time.

"As a matter of fact, they are so plentiful that you have to be careful not to drive them down with your car," he said.

A considerable number of moose are being taken in the Babine country by B. C. hunters and also Americans who are flocking there in numbers, Mr. Van der sluis said.


