Adventure Quay In Paris Heart

PARIS (Reuters) — Thousands of people daily may glance down at the half-dozen ships tied up in a stretch of the River Seine without suspecting the stories behind them and their skippers.

The ships, flying the flags of many nations in the heart of Paris range from scow-like houseboats to knife-proved yachts. The captains of these vessels are equally varied.

One of the latest adventurers to cast off from this "quay of adventure" was 28-year-old Marcel Bardiaux, who set out in his tiny sloop, Four Winds, to sail single-handed around the world.

An incoming craft was the bulbous Dutch barge, De Brave Hendrix, belonging to Jack Bilbo. This black-bearded giant is already well known in many lands for his "adventures" in art and literature.

He is the sculptor of the largest nude statue in the world, painter of a thousand incomprehensible canvases and author of "I Carried a Gun for Al Capone."

Son of a German circus-owner, he had been drifting around the Mediterranean with no other object than to "sail on and on while the boat stands it."

SAILS ALONE

A French adventurer who moors frequently at the quay is Jean Saint-Maur, a former naval man who sails in an old submarine chaser christened Tao.

When ashore, he paints murals, organizes art exhibitions and prepares the decor and costumes for ballets. He says that his curious, combined profession of painter and sailor once saved his life.

Captured by the Japanese during the war, he was already facing a firing squad when the officer in command asked his profession. When he replied "artist," he was reprieved and allowed to study Japanese lacquer painting.
