The Journal, referred to in the Daily News] a few days ago, published on Third Avenue, just east of Mc-Bride Street, in one of the first buildings ever erected in that neighborhood. The site was near ground now occupied by a laundry. The times were stirring. Street grading, heavy blasting, real estate selling, electioneering, retaining wall construction and daily rainfalls were all going strong. 
