THROUGHOUT THE YEAR this community responds generously to the many calls made upon it to support the needs of others less fortunate. The request for our practical concern and interest for the welfare of the blind is one call which knowingly we never overlook. We find it difficult to understand how life might continue to be complete without sight.

To us blindness is puzzling, bewildering, almost without understanding. We do not know how we could continue our family and community relations, our employment, our full life with respect to recreation, social and cultural activities. We do not know how we would meet blindness if it came to us tomorrow. It is good therefore, to know that something is being done about all this for our blind fellow citizens throughout this province.

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind is constantly assisting many hundreds of our blind friends to understand blindness and all that it means. The staff of the Institute counsel and teach in all things which will be supplementary and helpful to those who are without sight.

We may well ask ourselves "What would we do if we were to lose our sight tomorrow?" The obvious answer would be for us to seek the service and advice of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind in order to help us to a fuller understanding of life without sight and the method by which we might become adjusted to it.

Our consideration of the needs of the blind and of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind which provides the answer will prompt us to be more generous than ever as we respond to the current appeal on behalf of the blind. Opportunity in this regard will be forthcoming tomorrow when the I.O.D.E. sponsors its annual tag day in behalf of the C.N.I.B. Give generously.



The new shrimp sorter that will be demonstrated by Mr. Lantz is at the Fishermen's Cooperative. This apparatus sorts shrimps into three commercial grades of prawns, giant reds, side stripes or pinks, right on board the boat and can be operated manually or by the boats drive mechanism. Besides saving labor in sorting shrimp it also returns the under commercial size shrimps to the sea undamaged thus conserving them for future catches.

Another operation to be demonstratd is the use of a washer schreen attachment which when used as a washer prior to filleting operations reduces bacterial count very substantially.
