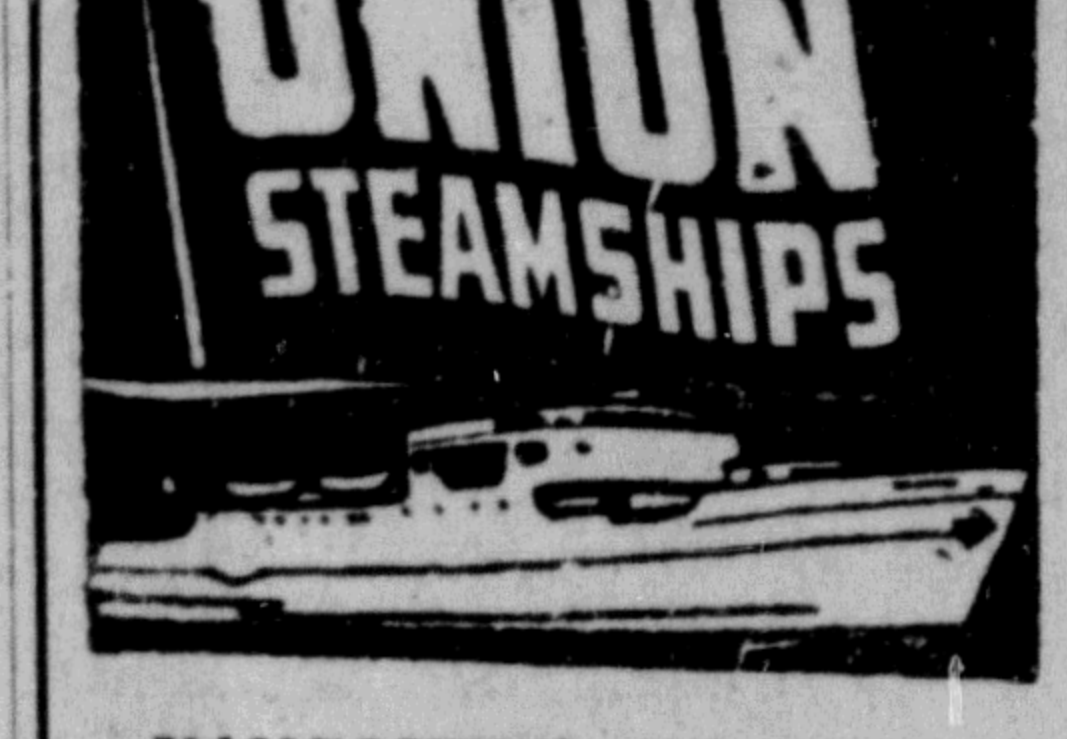

Police Court Fines Higher

Fines in city police court last month totalled 1,065, considerably more than February's total of \$555. Total revenue amounted to 1,180.75 of which 115.75 were court costs. The figures were contained in a B.C. Police report compiled by Cpl. E. A. Wales.

On the police list one of the two outstanding cases for the month was that of Angus McEachern who was convicted on a charge of making explosives and sentenced to three months in Okalla. The case was unique in that seldom in connection with safe-blowings, is there a charge of the actual manufacture of "soup".

More care is being taken by business establishments in regards to securing doors and window of buildings. Last month, night patrols found six premises insecure, two less than in February.

Eight motor vehicle accidents were reported to police last month, a decrease of seven for the month previous. One charge was laid for reckless driving and one for a hit and run accident. Convictions were given in each case.
