

Noted Paintings For Hobby Show

Miss Jean Park Cameron, Canadian artist, has sent out approximately thirty paintings to be displayed at the forthcoming Hobby Show at the Civic Centre. Miss Cameron paints entirely in oils and is very versatile in her work, painting landscapes, still life and portraits with equal skill.

Miss Cameron, whose work hangs in the Art Galleries in many parts of the world, has a

studio in Stratford, Ontario, and the majority of her pictures are displayed on permanent exhibition in Carroll Fine Art Galleries of Toronto. She is a pupil of the noted Canadian portrait painter, Archibald Barnes, R.C.A. of Toronto, and a member of the Canadian Federation of Artists, the National Gallery of Canada, the Art Gallery of Toronto, the Canadian Group of Painters, and the Western Ontario Society of Artists.

Among her paintings is a scene showing Baddeck Bay, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, with the summer home of Dr. Alexander Graham Bell on the hill at the left. A reproduction of this painting was featured in the March publication of the "Blue Bell", a magazine published by the Bell Telephone Company of Canada.

There are also a number of scenes painted in the vicinity of Jasper, Alberta, including one of Medicine Lake, and another of Mount Tekarra looking towards the Athabasca River and showing the historical site of Old Fort Point. Another view, on display in the lobby of the Civic Centre, shows Mount Edith Cavell and Lake Annette in an evening setting near Jasper Park Lodge.

Miss Cameron's favorite of all these paintings is a scene entitled "Blue Rocks", a little fishing village near Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. It shows the small houses perched on the rocks, a cove with fishing dories anchored, and the sea and surf. Other Cape Breton scenes are "Black Rock" at the citadel in Louisbourg, one of the swordfishing boats at Louisbourg harbour, and another painting of the rocky shore where Wolfe landed in 1758 to conquer the citadel. Also included are two interesting portrait studies, one of an old man, and another of a young boy.

Just recently, Miss Cameron sold two paintings to the Mutual Life Assurance Company at Waterloo, Ontario, who intend to have them reproduced for use as birthday greeting cards from the Company. One portrays an autumn woods landscape, and another a mixed bouquet of roses, phlox and cosmos in a cornucopia vase.
