**Log Scaling
Stays Steady**

Output For 1950 Almost
At Stand-off with 1949

Log scaling in Prince Rupert
forestry district for 1950 to date
stands at an aggregate of 46,
381,137 board feet which is al-
most a stand-off with 47,519,430
board feet during the correspond-
ing period of 1949.

The scale per varieties this Ap-
ril was as follows:
Cedar, 447,489 board feet
Spruce, 12,532,793 board feet
Hemlock, 2,687,593 board feet
Balsam, 673,474 board feet
Jackpine, 2,306,581 board feet
The total log scale for April was
18,647,930 board feet, a slight in-
crease from the 17,083,627 board
feet in the same month last year.
Production of poles and piling in
the interior this year was 93,825
lineal feet — 88,954 lineal
feet cedar, 1,121 lineal feet hem-
lock and 3,750 lineal feet jack-
pine—as compared with 40,996
lineal feet in the same month
last year. The aggregate of forest
products for this year to date
is 396,793 lineal feet, far below
last year's 1,351,396 feet.

The tie count this April was
9,147 pieces (jackpine) compared
with 18,937 pieces in April last
year.
Cordwood scaling this April
was 224 cords.

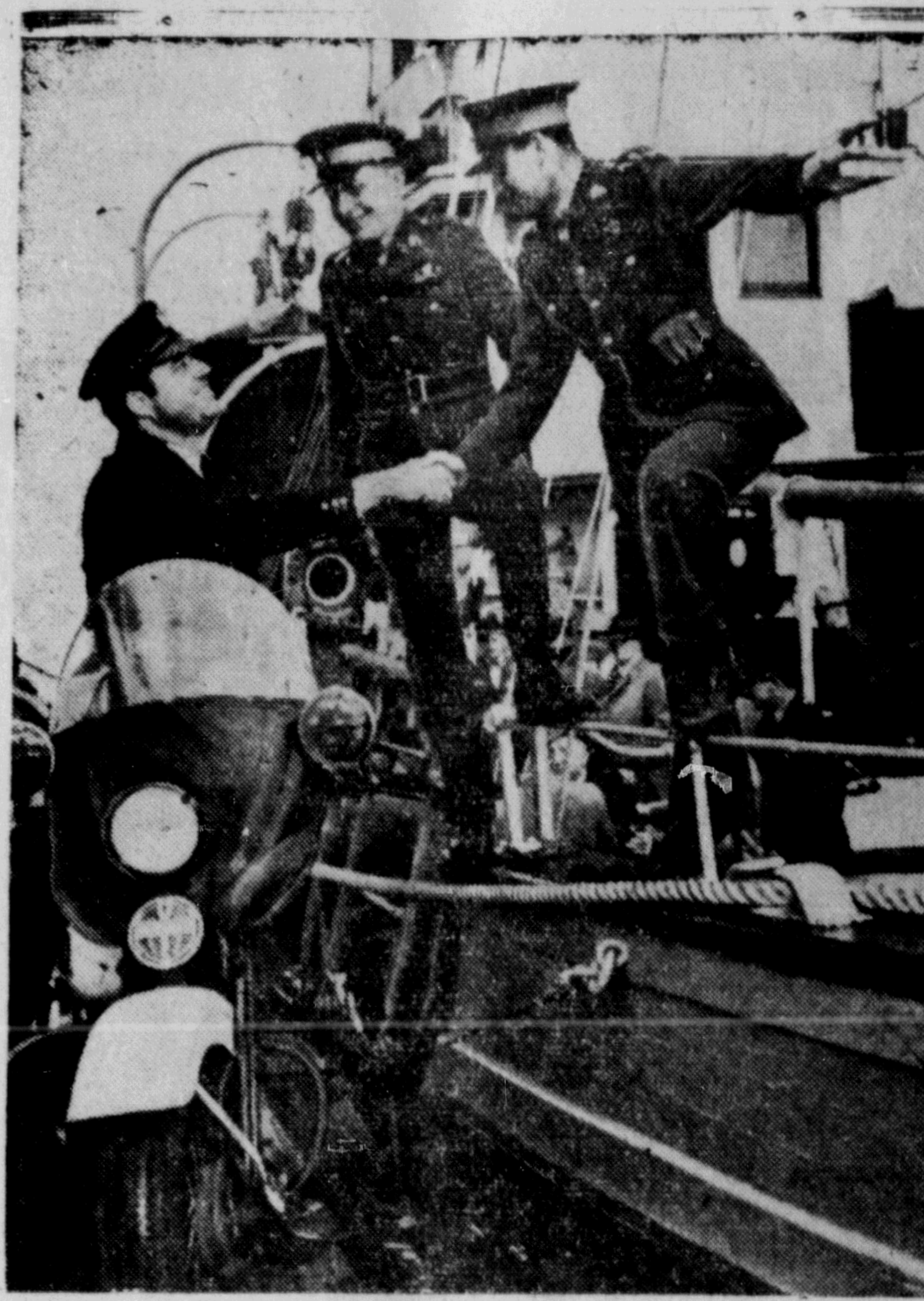

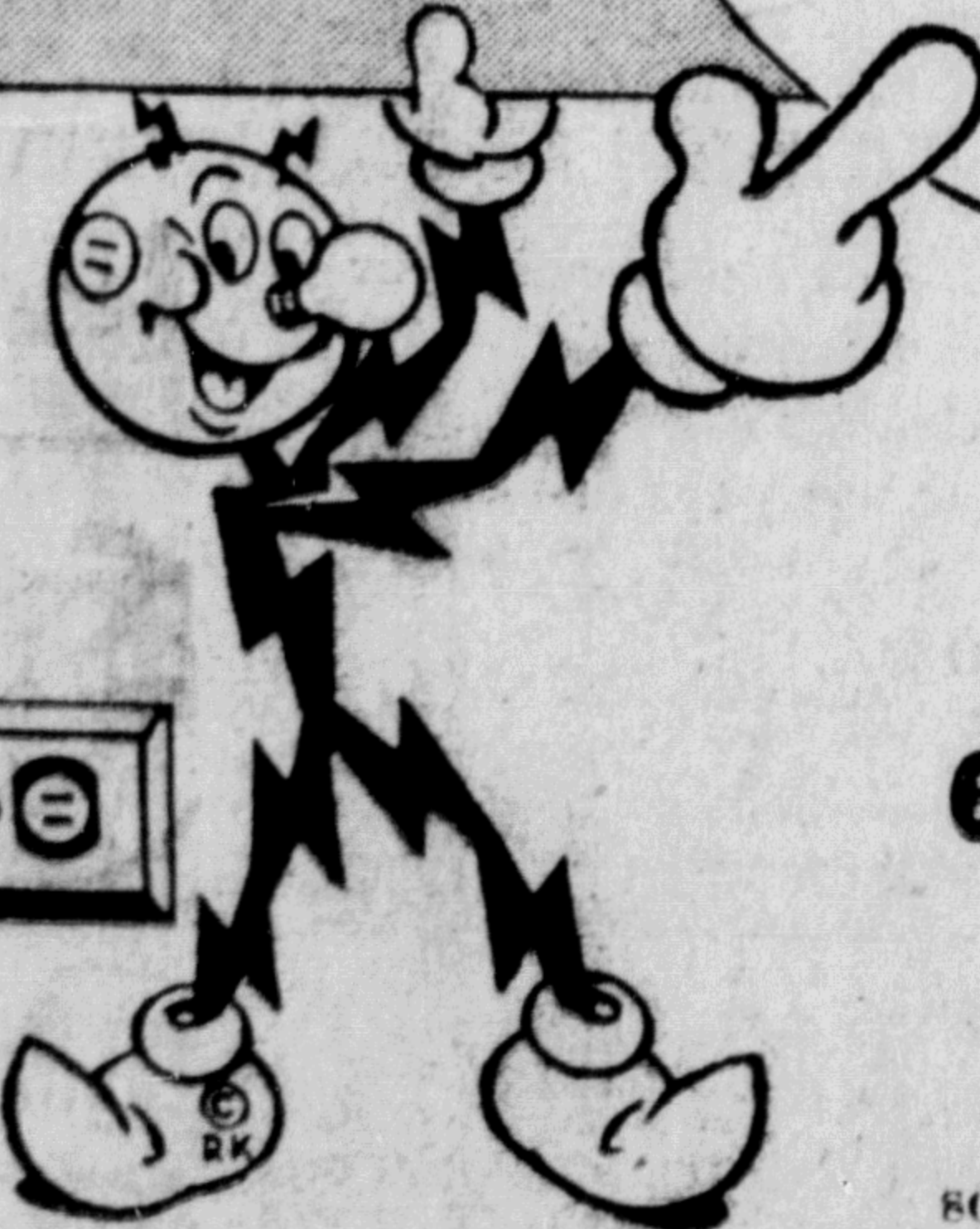
