FINANCIAL POST, one of Canada's leading national business papers, features British Columbia in its current issue and central and northern British Columbia figures prominently in a special supplement. It is no mere accident that Prince Rupert should be mentioned four times and Prince George three times in the principal article while Vancouver is mentioned only twice.

Then the special general article goes on—"British Columbians have so many development projects to be excited about that it's hard to tell which are most significant for future growth. Two hold the forefront in public discussion—aluminum and railway—highway extension toward northern oil, wheat and range lands of the Cariboo and Peace areas."

It is the aluminum that is being watched, with the most alert interests in the long term view, the article says—the project 100 miles from Prince Rupert which may involve an expenditure of \$500,000,000.

The huge \$35,000,000 plant of Columbia Cellulose (Celanese of America) at Prince Rupert also receives prominent mention.

It is interesting to note how others view us. Possibly some of us are not fully appreciative of the changing scene in British Columbia which is attracting the attention of all Canada in a way it never did before.

Canada's Size Impresses Him

"It is only since I came to Canada that I found out how small Ireland is. I was surprised at the vastness of this country," declared David Murphy, relieving student pastor at First Presbyterian Church here, who spoke at a Rotary Club luncheon Thursday afternoon.

Mr. Murphy confessed he liked Prince Rupert very much but, he added, it comes second to Ireland. "It is very beautiful country," he said. "If a person from Prince Rupert went to Belfast, he would experience a similar climate."

Mr. Murphy described the terrain of the northern and southern sections of the country and mentioned certain particular beauty spots, attractive to the tourist trade.

Southern Ireland, which is an independent nation, he said, was slightly backward as compared to the northern section. Agriculture engaged 75 per cent of the people. In northern Ireland, he pointed out, this is reversed, with 75 per cent of the country engaged in industrial work.

The speaker told of Belfast, a city of 500,000 people, very industrial, with the linen industry, the largest rope works in the world and one of the largest spinning mills on the globe.

Much damage was done during the war, he said. He remarked that various accents are spoken in his section of the Island. But in southern Ireland, a distinct brogue is evident.

"A very beautiful accent," the minister said. Dublin is a tourist city. Situated in the lower half of Ireland, which did not suffer much through the war, the city is noted for its historical sights. There is plenty of food in Ire-
