GREAT PLACE FOR CHILDREN

JASPER PARK—The great Rocky Mountain area known as Jasper National Park, with its myriad of beautiful and mysterious mountains, its wide and narrow valleys, jeweled lakes and rushing torrents, has long been associated in people's minds as the playground of Canada.

This "playground" idea appeals to the adult mind, conjuring up memories of childhood and youth, when, with a carefree mind, all kinds of sport was indulged in with an abandon of body and spirit. Here, in the Canadian Rockies, can be found Ponce de Leon's mystic spring of eternal youth, and the grown-ups flock to this great park from the four corners of the world in search of it—and they do indeed find it. But for the really young, the little children and the teenagers, De Leon's spring is ignored, because it is not needed. Here, in the Rockies, children of all ages find at hand so many outlets for their limitless energies and imagination as to make them literally believe in Fairyland.

This is particularly true of Jasper Park Lodge. Children naturally love beauty, and freedom, and grace. The wide, beautifully landscaped lawns, bordered with brilliant flower beds, are an irresistible temptation to the little tots to romp and roll to their heart's content. And no one minds if perchance a particular flower appeals strongly to a child, and she plucks it to have it near her always. There are so very many that even the browsing wild deer, with a fondness for some particular varieties, make very little appreciable effect upon the gardens. Children also love horses, and here, from the age of three and up, they ride almost daily with their parents on the miles of scenic sawdust trails, along which bear, deer, elk and moose gambol. On these rides children come so close to nature. Overhead, great variety of brilliantly-plumed Rocky Mountain birds circle and whistle and chatter to each other. They see a mother bear taking very good care of her children, and when they misbehave as all children sometimes will do, they see mother bear correct them in the good old-fashioned way, just like at home.

And when the sun beams down warmly, there is the beautiful outdoor pool, right in front of the Lodge on the shore of Lac Beauvert. For little tots, one end of the pool is set aside and protected at wading depth. Here many gleeful hours are spent. For the more adventurous teen-agers, there is the larger section of the pool, with its three graduated diving boards. Nearby are the tennis courts, so popular with the younger set that all day long the white balls can be seen going back and forth, back and forth across the nets with almost monotonous regularity.

Charles Beats Gallant Gus

Heavyweight Title Bout Ended to Save Lesnevich

NEW YORK — Ezzard Charles, National Boxing Association-recognized world's heavyweight boxing champion, stopped Gus Lesnevich, 34-year-old ex-light-heavyweight king, last night when Referee Goldstein ended the contest at the end of the seventh round in Yankee Stadium.

A small crowd of some 15,000 watched the 28-year old Charles, defending his title for the first time only 49 days after he won it at Chicago, give Lesnevich a bad pasting, cutting Gus around the left eye and plugging up the right eye.

Manager Joe Vella asked Goldstein to stop the fight as Gus came back to his corner, a tired beaten fighter at the end of the seventh. He made a gallant stand in the sixth when he seemed to hurt Charles with a stiff over-hand right.

Charles, much more aggressive than on the night he won the title by cautiously outpointing Jersey Joe Walcott at Chicago June 22, buckled Gus' legs in the fourth but the gallant Gus never did go down.

The end came suddenly for Gus seemed all right as he went to his corner. Never had he been down but blood streamed

from cuts over and under the left eye. There was an egg-sized bump under his right eye.

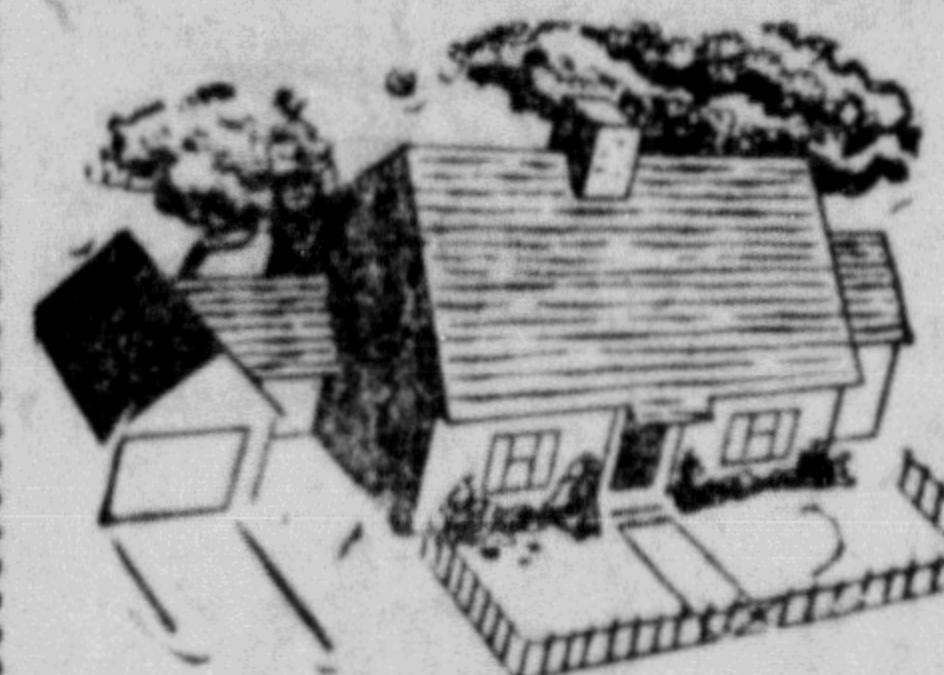

Return Series to Be Played in City This Week-End

Plans for the coming baseball series with Ketchikan were brought to the final stage Tuesday night when the Prince Rupert Baseball Association executive met. Following a telephone conversation with Bill Eastman of Ketchikan, Art Murray disclosed that the Alaskans would fly here for games Sunday afternoon and evening. The visitors had planned on coming by boat but agreed to the change in transportation so that, if the weather is not favorable, it would be possible to postpone the trip.

It will take better than \$600 to finance the series and, with a short margin in the bank, the local club is justifiably nervous about taking chances on the weather.

An outstanding feature of the series will be the game in which veteran Bill Eastman of Ketchikan and the local oldtimer, Bill Lambie, will be paired off on the respective mounds. It is twenty-seven years since Lambie first pitched against Ketchikan and, while Eastman's record is not at present available, is believed that he made his debut almost as long ago. Judging by Lambie's performance in a local league game this season, Eastman will have to be in good form.

Alex Bill was appointed manager of the local squad and Ed Davis and Johnny Odowes will lend their talent in coaching roles.

Bill Seuby and S. J. Mellor, new members of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club, provided the program at the club's weekly luncheon today, giving autobiographical talks. President R. G. Van der sluis was in the chair.

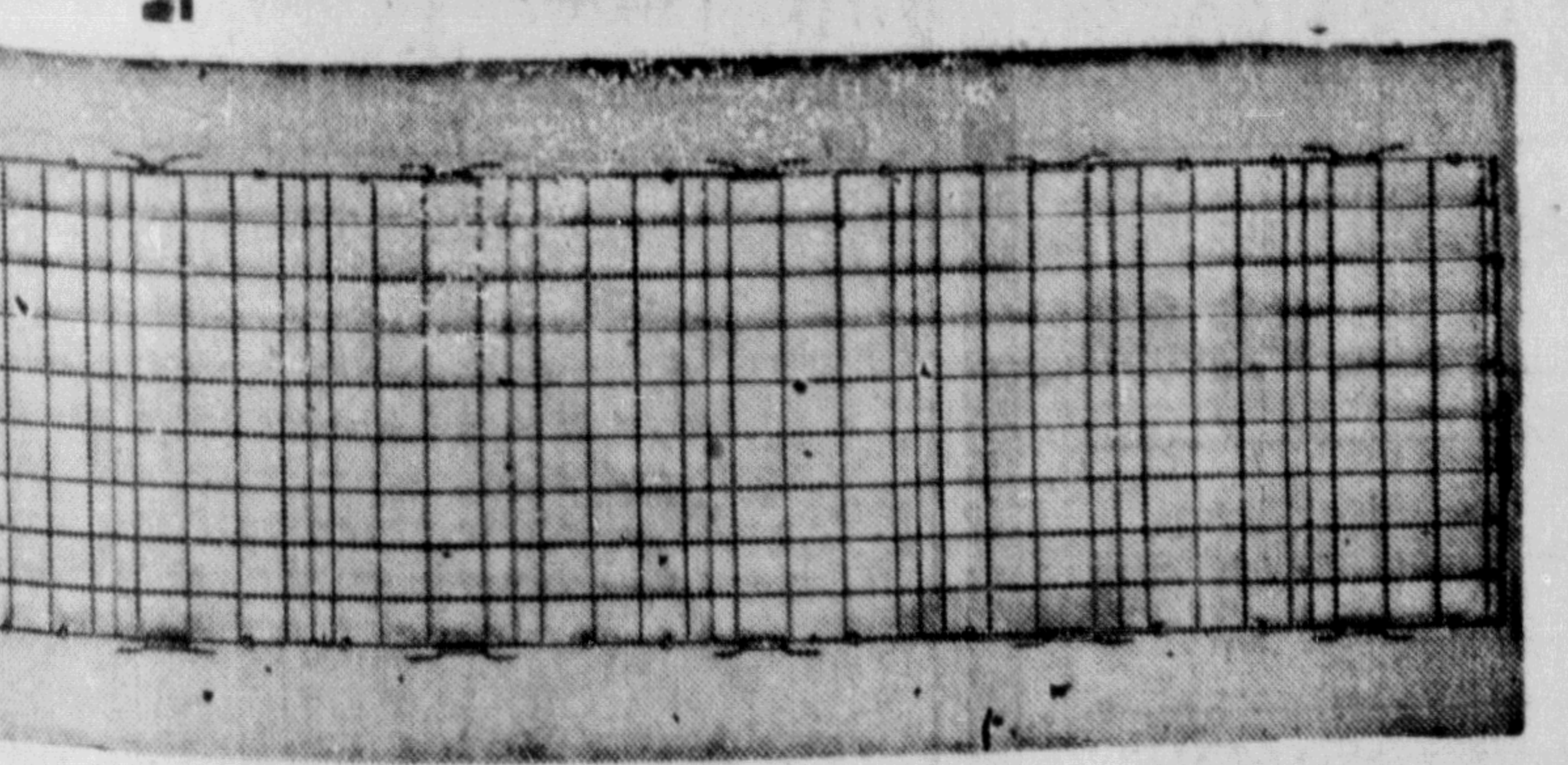
