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east to McBride Street, ending at the Civic Centre where Mayor Nora E. Arnold will officially open the Carnival in a ceremony at the main entrance of the Centre. The parade will be led by the Shrine Club Band, the Civic Centre Carnival Car as the Mayor's official vehicle and a specially decorated float on which the contestants for bathing beauty and queen honors will ride.

The committee received the decision of the Horticultural Society to postpone their annual flower show. Society President C. P. Balagno reported that unfavorable growing conditions forced the Society to postpone the show to a later date. This show has been one of the features of the Carnival for many years but its cancellation is offset by the fact that the Industrial Exhibition this year can be enlarged upon now that additional space is available. Industrial chairman Ed. Mussellam reported that there would be large numbers of exhibitors this year with a special School Board Display featuring models of the proposed new schools, a basket-weaving display and other interesting exhibits.

The committee inspected the Joyland train installation which will be used by both young and old. It was decided with the special children's features being offered this year, that the Thursday of Carnival Week would be Kiddies' Day. There will be a free vaudeville show and free rides on the train during the afternoon. In the evening the winners of the most Perfect Child Contest will be crowned Junior King and Queen of the Carnival. Another special feature for children this year is to be the Pet Show to be held Wednesday evening. Youngsters are already preparing their pets in a show that will determine the biggest pet, the smallest pet, the blackest pet, the whitest pet, the oldest pet, and the best alley cat in the city. There is no entry fee, the only stipulation being that the pets must be under the control of the exhibitor at all times, either on a leash or in a cage and that all exhibitors be children under the age of 15.

There will be first class entertainment for both young and old this year. The Four Dukes have been engaged for dancing each evening from Monday to Friday, with Roy Wheeler of Vancouver as Master of Ceremonies of the stage shows and special events throughout the week. Wheeler is a magician

and night club entertainer who comes here direct from the Canadian and American Night Club circuit. An added attraction at the Carnival will be the featuring of Ken Fagen of San Francisco, who specializes in fire eating and hypnotism. Fagen has just completed a successful tour of Alaskan cities.

The culminating feature of the Carnival will again be the Coronation of the winner of the Beauty Contest as this year's Carnival Queen. This event will be held on Friday evening with all the ceremony traditional to the crowning of Prince Rupert's Queen. The Shrine Band will provide a guard of honor and the second and third place winners of the Contest will be acclaimed as Princesses. In the Queen's retinue will be the newly crowned Junior King and Queen and their attendants.

As usual, the Carnival is a hundred percent volunteer effort on the part of the various organizations and hundreds of citizens who each year man the many concessions and attractions offered to the citizens of Prince Rupert in this major effort in the support of this city's finest of Civic Centres.

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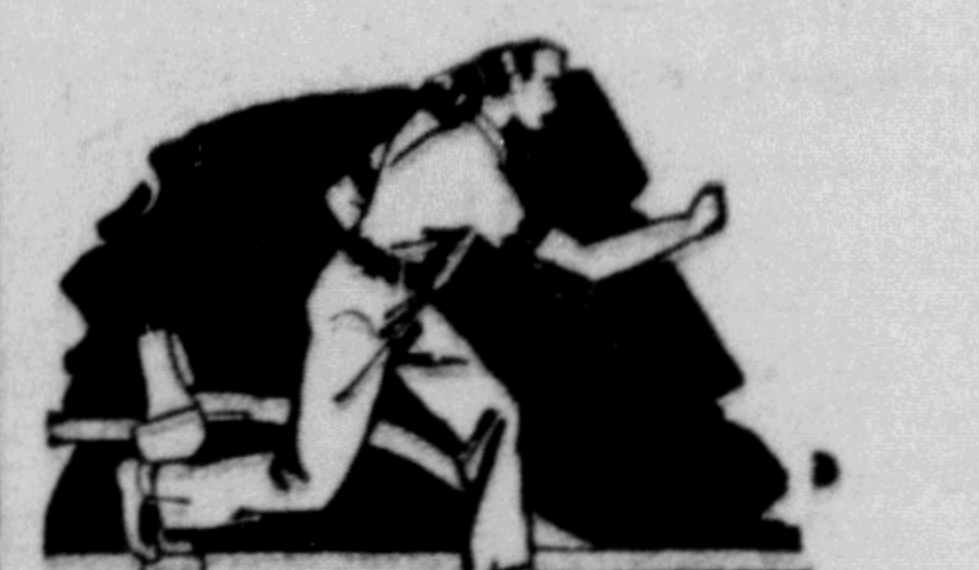
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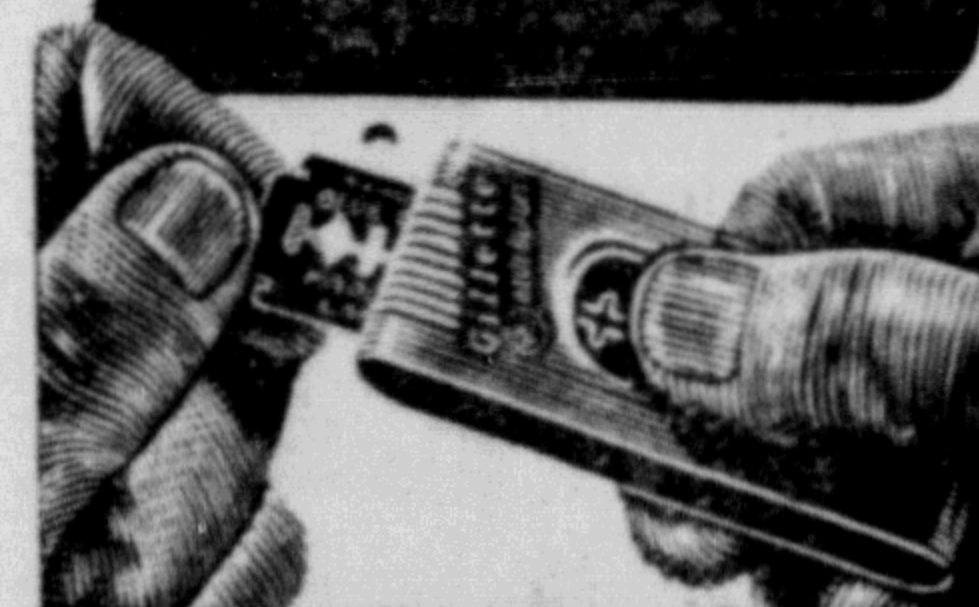
PLAY BALL

Should the weatherman have a change of heart and favor us with a smile this evening, the Commercial and Merchant Squads will tangle in the league fixture.

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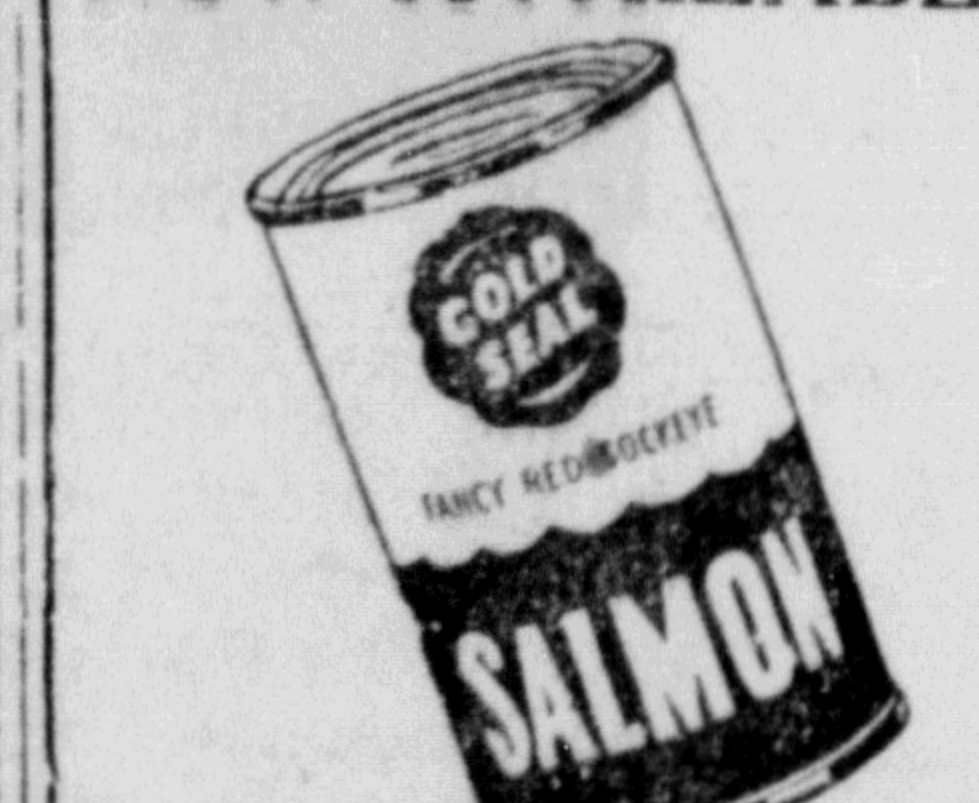
