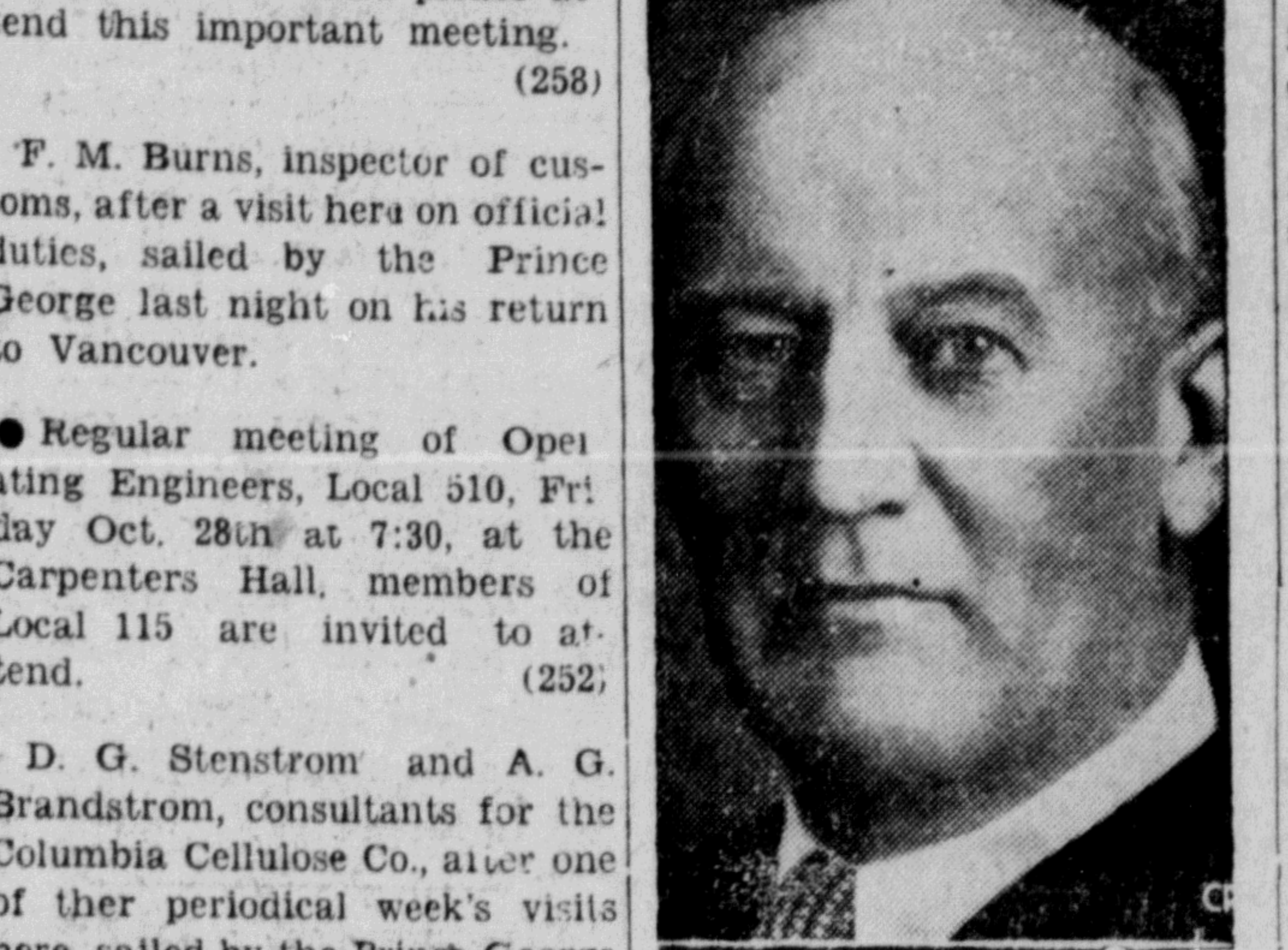

MINES OWNER AND FINANCIER—Robert A. Bryce who was elected president of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce at its meeting in Montreal this week, went in to northern Ontario in 1907 with his degree of mining engineer from the University of Toronto and three years' experience in Mexico. Today, at 68, still a giant of a man standing over six feet, he is President of two gold mines, Macassa Ltd., and Renable Mines Ltd., a director of several financial institutions and industries, and a member of the Board of Governors of the University of Toronto. STORE ROBBERY SPEEDILY SOLVED

Alertness on the part of a city merchant was responsible for the quick solution to the breaking and entering of another suburban store on Thursday.

G. P. Lyons, proprietor of a grocery store at Fifth Avenue and McBride Street, telephoned the police after a youth, carrying a large quantity of silver, had changed some of the coins for a \$5 bill Thursday morning.

Previously, the police had received a call that Spero's Quality Grocery Store on Eighth Avenue West had been broken into during the night and, at the time of the second call, was being investigated. Connecting the two incidents, the police rounded up a 15-year-old youth who admitted to the theft.

Entry into the store was gained by forcing the back door of the store. About \$11 in silver was taken.
