Lake by an official Radio Inspector of the Department of Transport. The report reads as follows:

"I have carried out a survey of radio reception conditions here today and have been unable to detect any radio interference from the power plant or from the overhead distribution system.

Neither have I been able to bring in any broadcasting stations up to the time of writing (9 p.m.)."

BOOSTER STATIONS

"During the past ten years repeated representations have been made to the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation by various Boards of Trade and other public bodies from Central British Columbia, and the situation regarding radio is fully set forth. But the time is now opportune to again stress that lines to transmit radio programs through to Prince Rupert are available and that the obvious remedy is to have repeater or booster stations installed at Vanderhoof, Burns Lake, Smithers and Terrace.

"The sparsely-settled districts lying to the north and south of the Canadian National Railways

would thus obtain decent reception facilities, and have access to the best Canadian programs instead of having to rely on United States reception, which during the day is extremely variable.

"It is extremely necessary that arrangements be made with the Radio stations at Prince George and Prince Rupert to release through these stations the full CBC Programs instead of only "sustaining" programs as at present.

"As is generally well known the entire area between Prince Rupert and Prince George is developing rapidly with many new industries being established, these requiring additional staff. The cultural entertainment of this vast area is far short of that available in the larger centres of Southern British Columbia, therefore it is essential that better radio service be given the area by the CBC. Better radio service is a very definite step forward in bettering the culture.

"With better radio service there is no doubt that more radios would be in service and thus produce more revenue in radio fees for the CBC.

"The providing of improved radio service by the CBC, as requested by this organization and others, would not only be sincerely appreciated by the population concerned, but would assist materially in the present and future development of the huge area of Central British Columbia.

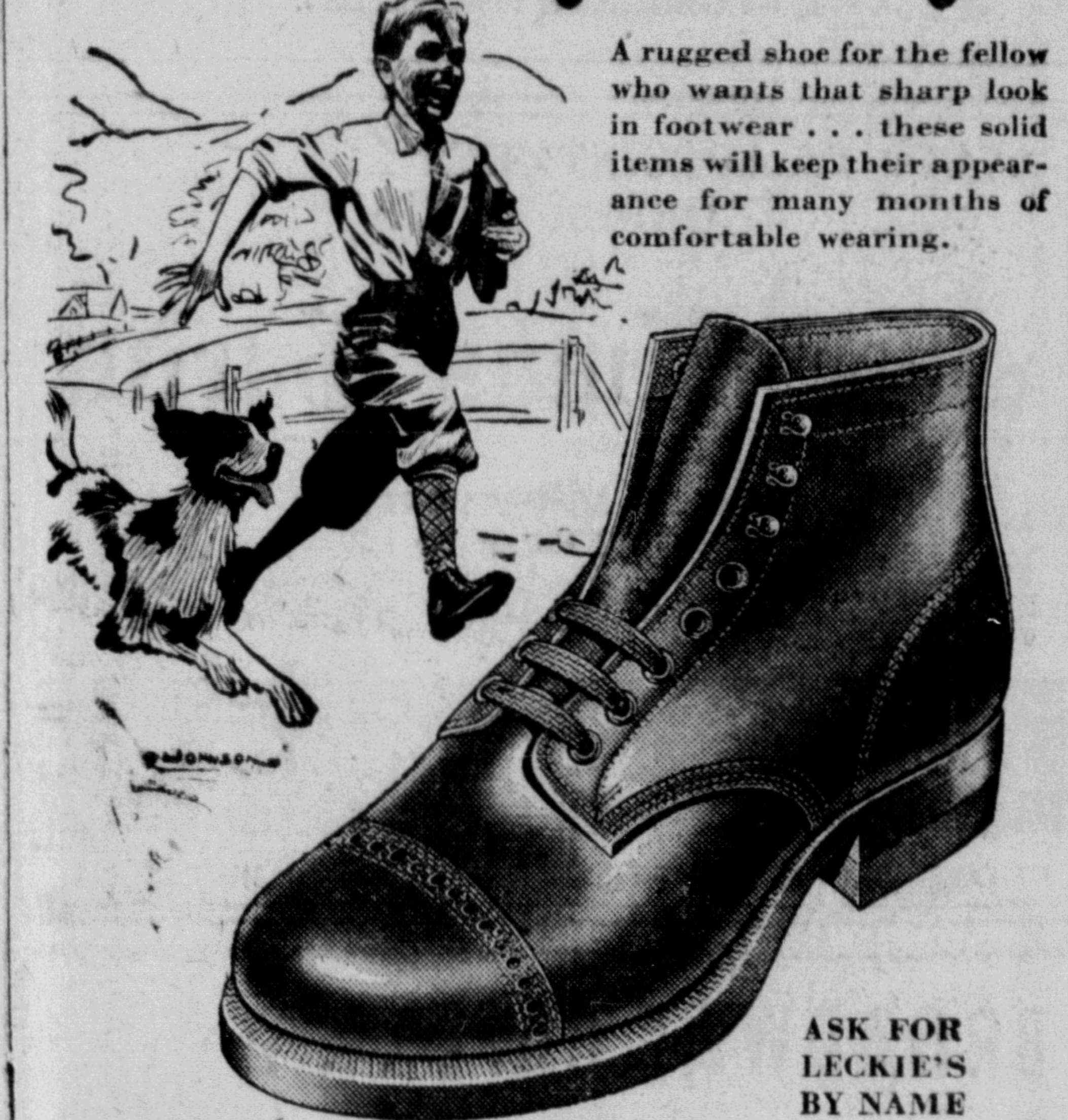

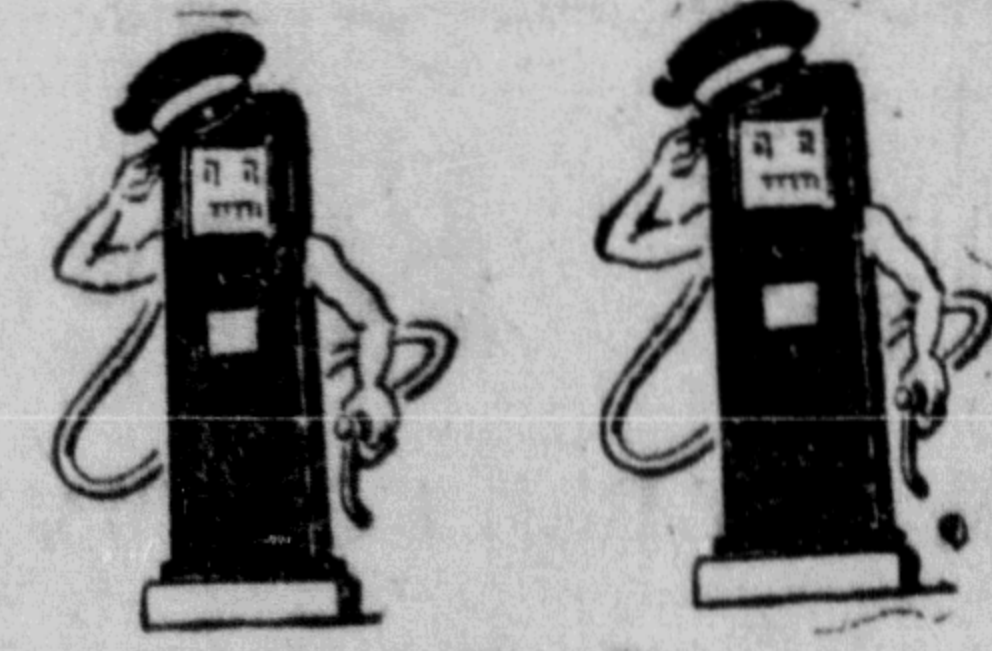
