SHORT SPORT

Punch by punch, hard hitting Eddie Haddad, of Winnipeg, has been making boxing history in Golden Glove championships of the Pacific Coast. A Supply Assistant in the Royal Canadian Navy's west coast training establishment, H.M.C.S. Naden, Haddad has proved himself a heavy favorite for lightweight honors at the Dominion Olympic trials in May.

This 135 pound fireball has captured every boxing title for amateurs on the West Coast. Last February he won the British Columbia Golden Gloves championship for his weight in Vancouver, then went on to Seattle to punch his way to the top of the lightweight class at the Pacific North West Golden Gloves against a strong field of Canadian and American contenders. This was a repeat performance for the Navy fighter. In 1947 he won both the B.C. Golden Gloves and the P.N.W. championships, and was named "Golden Boy" for that year.

Again, in the provincial boxing championships held in Vancouver March 29, the Navy fighter demonstrated what two lethal fists can do, winning the event with ease. He now looks forward to the Diamond Belt Western Canadian Boxing championships which are to be held on April 30 to May 1. Vancouver sportswriters are already counting Eddie in, and if he goes on to victory at the Dominion meet in Montreal, the Olympics in London, England, will be before him.

Eddie Haddad is a ring veteran for all his 20 years. Receiving excellent training with the Y.M.C.A. and the C.N.R. Athletic Club in Winnipeg, he won the Manitoba lightweight championship in February, 1946, before he joined the R.C.N. Packing a sedative in either fist, Haddad has won over 30 fights, 12 of them by the K.O. route.

CITY FASTBALL TEAM DEADLINE SET APRIL 30

Team entries for the city fastball league will be received up to Friday, April 30, a meeting of the Prince Rupert Fastball Association held at the Civic Centre Sunday afternoon decided. The league hopes to get in action at Gyro Park early in May.

Attended by 18 representatives of prospective teams, the meeting decided that the men's section of the league should play on Monday and Wednesday nights and that the ladies' section should play Tuesday and Thursday. Third games in the men's league will be played either Friday or Saturday nights, depending on which will conflict least with community events.

The meeting received the resignation of J. S. Wilson from the fast ball commission and decided to allow the remaining two commissioners to select his replacement. They also will choose a new chairman.

A good deal of discussion centered on the question of umpires for the league. It was decided that the home team be responsible for the plate umpire and the visiting team for the base umpire at each game. The two umpires will reverse their positions at the end of 4 1/2 innings. Umpires who are playing members of a team other than the teams concerned may also be used, if necessary.

However, anyone used as an umpire must have the approval of a general meeting of the association.

Following a review of last year's season, it was moved that the meeting go on record as expressing its appreciation of Miss Margaret Slinn, Neil Ross and Don Forward of the Civic Centre staff in helping to make the 1947 season a highly successful one.
