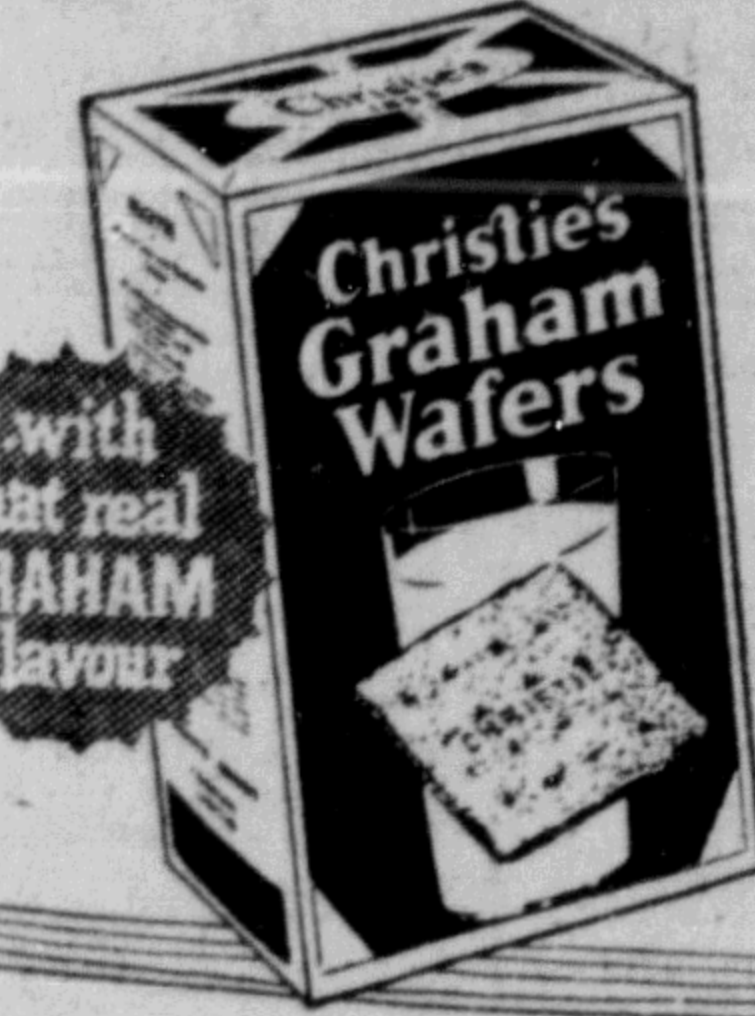
Stirring Address Sets Girls Moving
