the Beltsville Bird or the  
White turkey, is on the  
market in larger quantities, al-  
though the turkey crop, as a

Its average live weight is less  
than 10 pounds, compared with  
about 20 for the Broad-Breasted  
Bronze turkey. Ready for the  
oven, the Beltsville turkey  
weighs less than eight pounds  
on the average.

Government turkey experts  
began talking about developing  
a breed of small turkeys almost  
20 years ago.

#### EXPERIMENTS BEGIN

In 1934 the experiments  
started at Beltsville, Md., where  
there is a big government agri-  
cultural station.

The turkey scientists worked  
with five breeds, including wild  
turkeys. They finally came up  
with a satisfactory model in  
1940. It has some of all five

breeds in it. Now the birds are  
being produced in commercial  
quantities.

The 1948 model apartment  
turkey is white, so that its pin  
feathers aren't as noticeable.  
This makes it more attractive  
in the butcher's showcase.

It has a comparatively broad  
breast, which means more  
white meat. And it has compar-  
atively short, plump legs—  
which means better drumsticks.

## AIR SCHEDULE IS RESTORED

Scheduled service was restor-  
ed on Canadian Pacific Air Lines  
today following a disruption  
which delayed Wednesday's  
flight from Vancouver to Sand-  
spit, the Prince Rupert plane  
having to wait overnight for  
the connection, getting in this  
morning.

Cause of the delay was unfavor-  
able weather throughout a  
large area of Western Canada  
which caused planes to be  
grounded as far east as Calgary,  
tying up aircraft away from  
Vancouver so that no plane was  
available for the Vancouver-

Sandspit flight at the regular  
time.

Delay in arrival of the Van-  
couver-Sandspit plane at the  
Island transfer point caused the  
Prince Rupert return flight to  
be held up on account of dark-  
ness. The plane arrived here  
with passengers, mail and ex-  
press at 10 o'clock this morn-  
ing.

This afternoon's flights were  
reported to be on schedule.
