ENROLMENT IN SCHOOLS GROWS

Prince Rupert's school population increased slightly during October over the September level, principals' reports read at last night's School Board meeting showed, enrolment rising to 1,164 from 1,155 the previous month.

Rural school population last month was 87 in four schools, greatest centre being Port Essington, where the combined native and white enrolment was 44.

Enrolment at Booth Memorial High School was 456, a slight increase over September, according to the report of Principal A. M. Hurst. There were 136 in the junior high school and 269 in the senior.

At Borden Street, Principal J. S. Wilson reported, enrolment was 219 with a percentage of 93. Conrad Street's enrolment was 210 and the attendance percentage was 96, Principal T. G. Bateman reported.

King Edward's enrolment was 279 with an actual attendance of 277 and a percentage attendance of 95, according to Principal R. G. Moore's report.

At Port Essington, there were 24 pupils in the senior school and 20 in the junior. Port Simpson had an enrolment of 13, Digby Island 19 and Port Edward 11.
