### FORMER LOCAL BOY PUBLISHER

Cecil Hacker, formerly of Prince Rupert, has purchased the Abbotsford, Sumas and Matsqui News, one of the largest weekly newspapers published in the Fraser Valley.

Mr. Hacker is the son of the late Rev. G. G. Hacker, who for years served as pastor of the First United Church in Prince Rupert. The family will be well remembered in this city.

The new owner of the News was born in Saskatchewan and is a graduate of the University of British Columbia. He has had 20 years experience in the weekly newspaper business, having been associated with the Vernon News and Chilliwack Progress, as well as being identified with the publicity department of the B.C. Electric in Vancouver for a few years. Under the new ownership, the News will operate as the Hacker Press Ltd.

### REMINISCENCE INTERESTING

**Pioneer Recalls Dr. W. J. Quinlan's Trip to Telkwa**

The News not long ago published a reminiscence story descriptive of Dr. W. J. Quinlan, pioneer dentist, who was practising in Prince Rupert as long ago as 1909.

Surviving old timers found the yarn interesting, among them, Wiggs O'Neill of Smithers, who has been living in Smithers since railway building days, and who is also well known in Prince Rupert. He writes to The News, stating he knew Dr. Quinlan so well, and that he got a "kick" out of the little story recalling early days.

It was in 1912, Mr. O'Neill mentions, that business, having slackened off a bit in Prince Rupert, Dr. Quinlan decided to spend part of the summer in the hinterland. He packed his dental outfit in a couple of large trunks and shipped it to Telkwa aboard the steamer "Distributor." The property went through by boat along the Skeena River, and by freight without a hitch, to its destination.
