Construction activity in Prince Rupert in 1947, as indicated by the value of building permits issued during the year, was the lowest, by a slight margin, of any years since 1944.

Total value of building permits issued by the city engineer's office for the 12 months ust ended was \$210,340, as compared with \$230,980 in 1946 and \$267,279 in 1945.

Heaviest building month last year was June, when permits authorizing construction to the H. H. Davies, former purser value of \$55,510 were issued.
