Liquor Bill Is Alarming

Three Times More Than
Education, Five Times More
Than Churches

"Canadians last year spent \$485,000,000 on liquor, which is about three times more than they spent on education and more than five times the estimated amount spent by Canadian churches in carrying out their Christian program," de-

clared Rev. Dr. John Coburn, general secretary of the Canadian Temperance Federation, during an address in the United Church Hall last night. "During the past decade the amount of liquor consumed by Canadians has grown at an alarming rate and, while it soared, the once strong temperance movement declined," pointed out the speaker, "until there were only two or three provinces in the whole Dominion where temperance forces were at all active. Now, as far as the temperance Federation is concerned, the picture is changing." Dr. Coburn came out of retirement to take on the job of organizing the temperance forces on a national scale and last night he stated that there was now a full time temperance secretary in every province.

Dr. Coburn accused liquor drinking drivers of causing a large proportion of the traffic accidents in Canada. Dr. Rogers of Toronto, who has made a study of those involved in serious traffic accidents, estimates that 45 per cent were the result of drivers being under the in-

fluence of alcohol, said the speaker. "It isn't drunken drivers that usually cause the serious accidents," declared Dr. Coburn. "They seldom get far before being picked up. It is the man with just a few drinks who thinks he is sober while in reality his vision is impaired, his reactions slowed and his sense of responsibility lessened by the alcohol he has consumed."

CRIME WAVE NEVER WORSE

"The crime wave that is flooding across Canada was never so bad in the past as it is today," said Dr. Coburn, "and a large proportion of those crowding our penal institutions are young people." While the speaker did not think liquor was to blame for all crimes he did feel it was often a factor in starting a young man off in the wrong direction. The number of divorces, 7,500 in Canada last year, was another phase of the Canadian scene which is being aggravated by mixing liquor and home life. "And," declared the speaker, "an attack on the home is an attack on civilization itself."

There are 50,000 diseased alcoholics in Canada and 200,000 more who are probelms, said Dr. Coburn. One of the objectives the temperance federation aims at is to have the government spend part of the revenue gained through the sale of liquor in providing treatment for these people. Another aim of the federation is education through means of films, lectures and radio.
