1240 Kilocycles maintain normal trade contracts with the Dominion and the Unia ted States, Belgium (, Switzerland, France, Denmark, Sweden, Holland and Luxembourg.

> It permitted the import of non-essentials like glace cherries, gutter coloring, table glassware, metal office furniture, domestic cuttery, some electrical goods, rubber footwear, sporting guns and toilet preparations.

> The scheme in future will apply "only for those countries which offer up an adequate return within our general trade arrangements with them," Wilson told the House of Commons.

In a review of policy he said the main purpose was to protect the balance of payments by restricting imports to what Britain could afford to pay and to purchase essentials unobtainable in the home market.

"Nevertheless, the object of our policy is to maintain international trade at the highest possible level and within this policy there is room for the exchange of available goods not strictly necessary to either party provided this is clearly advantageous

In arrangements to import less ! essential goods, the emphasis would be on foodstuffs and consumer goods which formed a useful addition to home supplies asd satisfied a general consumption demand. These imports would not include, as far as could be arranged, consumption of goods of a purely luxury charac-

"The token import scheme, which is itself part of our current arrangements for the import of less essential goods, will in future be applied in accordance with the policy outlined above," Wilson said.
