(Thuja plicata)
Also known as Giant Cedar.

A coniferous tree found in moist flats, benches, gentle slopes, river bottoms, in and about swamps and wet, springy places, and in cool moist gulches and ravines. Moisture more important than quality or quantity of soil. Commonly grows to height of from 150 to 175 feet with diameter 3½ to 8 feet. Well known for panelling, siding, shingles, lumber, veneer, pulp and poles. Roots and bark used by Indians for baskets and mats.
