## Spring Frolic For Smithers

**Elaborate Plans Being Made For Many Features**  
SMITHERS—Backed by enthusiasm and new ideas the Smithers Junior Chamber of Commerce is rapidly completing plans for the presentation in May of 1950 of a gigantic spring festival to be termed "Spring Frolic." It is hoped that before long the flashing comet which is the insignia decided upon by the Jaycees will be a common sight to residents throughout the whole of north central British Columbia. The proceeds realized from the Frolic will go towards the expansion and completion of a large modern children's playground commenced last year by the Junior Chamber from the proceeds realized from a Klondyke Night put on by the Jaycees in April of 1948. This playground will include all modern units of playground equipment with consideration being given also to a merry-go-round. Also complete

rest room facilities will be included.  
The Frolic, which commences on May 4, will get under way with a huge parade which it is estimated will be one mile long and be a blaze of color headed by two drum majorettes carrying the blazing banners of the frolic. This parade under the directorship of Constable E. Corson of the Provincial Police will uphold the fame of Smithers which has become to be known for its outstanding parades.  
Games and sports will find the two days with an Athletic Exhibition intended as a highlight of the daytime festivities. A beauty contest for which it is planned to obtain entrants throughout the whole northern interior of the province will be one of the feature attractions. The chosen queen of this event to be crowned "Miss Northern B.C." and will be suitable rewarded for her merits. She will become the hostess of the Junior Chamber for the two days of the frolic and be the reigning personality over the

complete list of events.  
A fancy dress and masquerade ball will add a touch of the European to the festivities. This event under the directorship of Dr. Weber of Smithers who has had considerable experience to Europe in this form of entertainment is expected to be an outstanding success.  
A large quiz program is lined up with first prize being a 1950 Chevrolet Sedan.  
Tickets for the Spring Frolic will be going on sale shortly.
