Ketchikan, with some very smart basketball, won the annual high school international series by a 51-to-36 score. The first period was even with both teams playing excellent ball, the score at the half being 19 to 18 for Ketchikan. In the second half the locals lost their punch and the Alaskans gained confidence as their lead increased. The whole story of the game can be told in the scoring averages. Ketchikan made 36 per cent of the 54 field shots taken while Booth succeeded in only 10 1/2 per cent of their 72 shots. Ketchikan made 11 of their 19 foul throws for a better than 50 per cent average and Prince Rupert made 14 of their 27 for just under 50 per cent.

For the locals Ray Spring and Bud Ratchford played a bang-up game all evening and provided plenty of punch. Spring garnered 14 points and Ratchford, six. The team sadly missed McChesney, Kristmannson and Nickerson. This game certainly demonstrated that the basketball game can be won or lost in more ways than on the floor.

Coach Ray Basset can be complimented on the team he brought down from the North. Five of the players are from Grade 10, the rest from the senior grades. It was a Grade 10 player, Tucker, who was one of the standouts of the game with a big nine points. Another outstanding player was the older Tucker brother, who made 11 points and played very smart ball. This team is used to a much smaller floor and took a while to get acquainted with the Civic Centre gym. However, once they started to click, it was Ketchikan all the way.

Tonight the teams play the second game of the series and move on to Ketchikan in two weeks' time for the third and fourth games. Despite the reverse, the Bo-Me-Hi Rainmakers need not be counted out of the nervousness tonight and improve series. If they get over their shooting, there is no reason at all why they could not win this one.

A BY-LAW TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF LOT 16, BLOCK 20, SECTION 1, MAP 923, CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT, TO THE CANADIAN LEGION, BRITISH EMPIRE SERVICE LEAGUE, PRINCE RUPERT BRANCH NO. 27.

WHEREAS under the provisions of By-law No. 431, Lot Sixteen (16), Block Twenty (20), Section One (1), Map 923, was sold to John A. West, Harry L. Landrey and Sidney A. Bird, as Trustees for the Great War Veterans' Association of Canada (Prince Rupert Branch) for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00);

AND WHEREAS the said By-law No. 431 provided that in the event of this property not being used solely by the said Great War Veterans' Association of Canada (Prince Rupert Branch) the same shall revert to the City of Prince Rupert;

AND WHEREAS the said property is no longer used solely by the Great War Veterans' Association of Canada (Prince Rupert Branch) or by its successor, the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27;

AND WHEREAS the prelates on the said lot were placed thereon at the sole expense of the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, has offered to purchase the said Lot Sixteen (16), Block Twenty (20), Section One (1), Map 923, City of Prince Rupert, for the sum of Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$2,600.00), this sum representing the assessed value of the land only;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council deems it expedient to accept the said offer;

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT IN OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED ENACTS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. It shall be lawful for the City of Prince Rupert to sell to the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, its successors and assigns, all that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, being and being in the City of Prince Rupert, and more particularly known and described as Lot Sixteen (16), Block Twenty (20), Section One (1), Map 923.

2. After final passage of this By-law shall be made for the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Prince Rupert to execute a conveyance in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$2,600.00) from the City of Prince Rupert to the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, of the above described property.

3. Before final passage hereof this By-law shall be submitted to a vote of the Ratepayers of the City and approved by the requisite majority.

4. This By-law may be known and cited for all purposes as "Canadian Legion Land Sale By-law 1950."

A BY-LAW TO EXEMPT CERTAIN PROPERTIES OWNED BY THE CANADIAN LEGION, BRITISH EMPIRE SERVICE LEAGUE, PRINCE RUPERT BRANCH NO. 27 FROM TAXATION.

WHEREAS the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, are the owners of that portion of Waterfront Block "E", Map 823, shown outlined in red on explanatory plan No. 1965, and of Lot One (1), Map 2028;

AND WHEREAS a building occupied by and used exclusively for the purposes of the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, is situate thereon;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27, has prayed the Municipal Council to exempt from general taxation but not from local improvement taxation, water, garbage and telephone rates and charges, the whole of the said portion of Waterfront Block "E", shown outlined in red on explanatory plan No. 1965, and that portion of Lot One (1), Map 2028, lying to the west of a line drawn parallel to and along the west side of a line drawn parallel to and 169.07 feet distant easterly from the westerly boundary thereof;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the City of Prince Rupert deems it expedient to grant this request;

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT IN OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Following passage of this By-law it shall be lawful for the following described property to be exempt from general municipal taxation but not from local improvement taxes, water, garbage and telephone rates and charges for so long a period as the said property is occupied by and used exclusively for the purposes of the Canadian Legion, British Empire Service League, Prince Rupert Branch No. 27:

(a) That portion of Waterfront Block "E", Map 823, shown outlined in red on explanatory plan No. 1965.

(b) That portion of Lot One (1), Map 2028, lying to the west of a line drawn parallel to and 169.07 feet distant easterly from the westerly boundary thereof, all of which property is shown outlined in red and Schedule "A" attached hereto which is hereby made a part hereof.

2. Before final passage hereof this By-law shall be submitted to a vote of the Ratepayers of the City and approved by the requisite majority.

3. This By-law may be known and cited for all purposes as "Canadian Legion Taxation Exemption By-law 1950."
