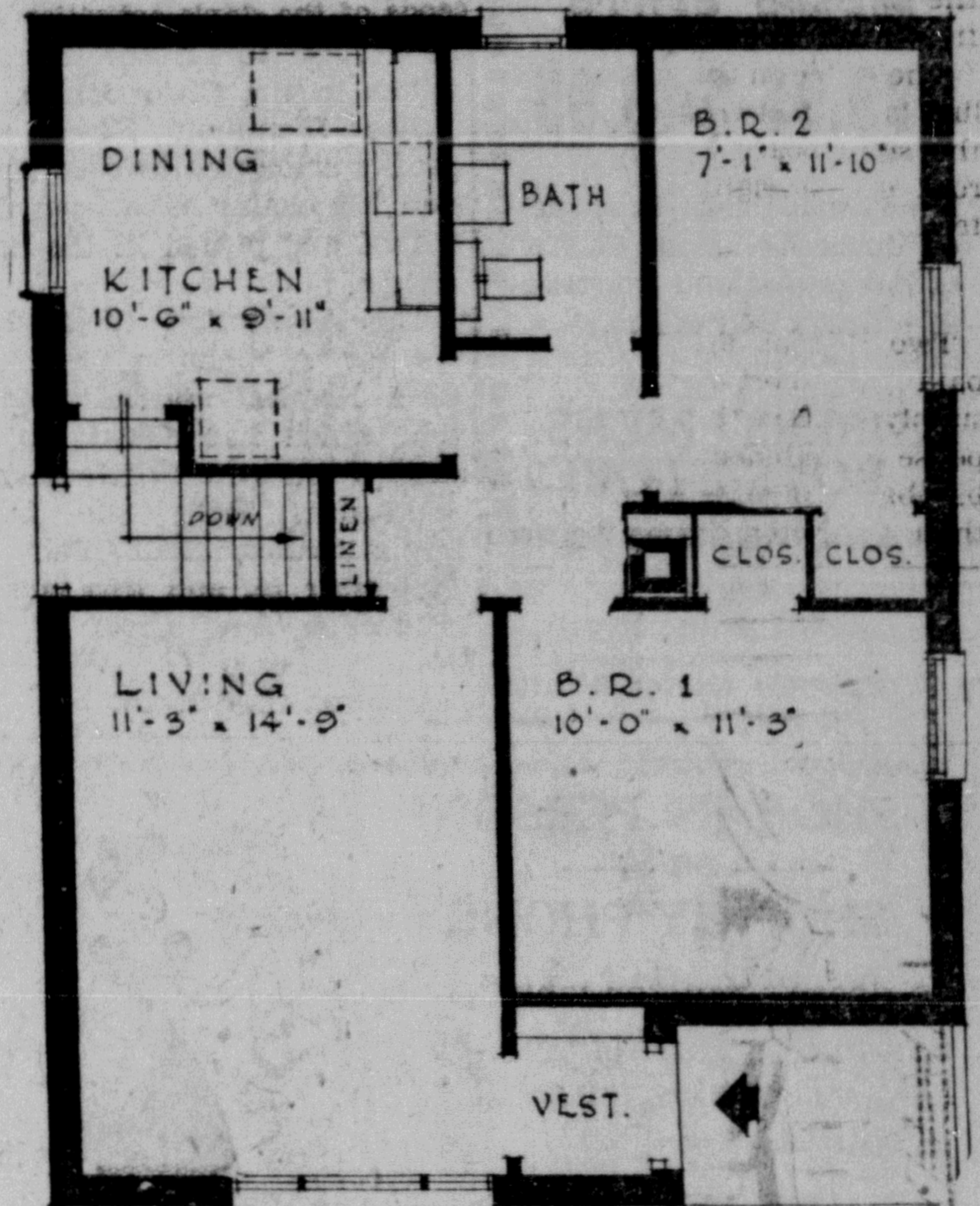

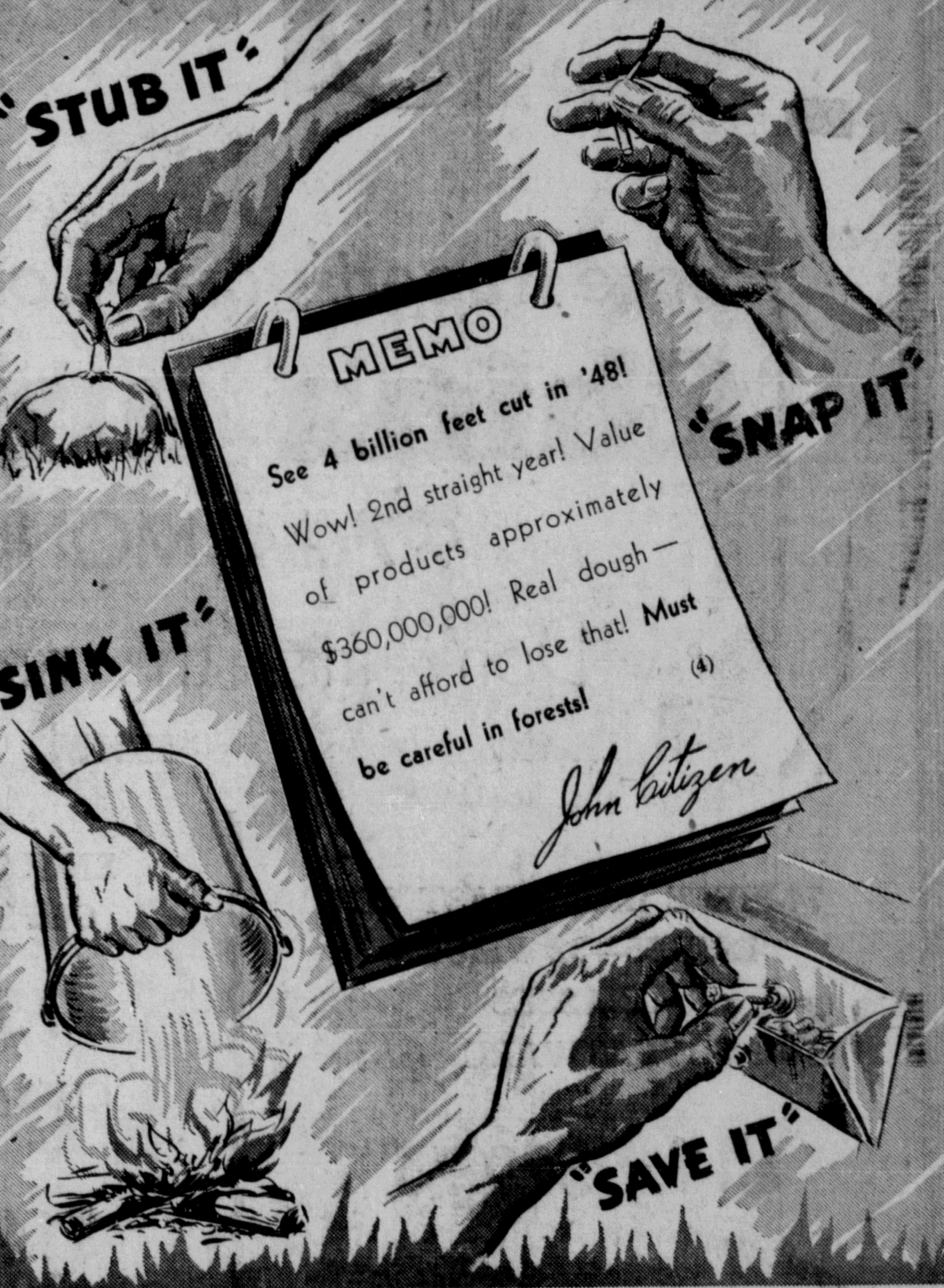


FLOOR PLAN

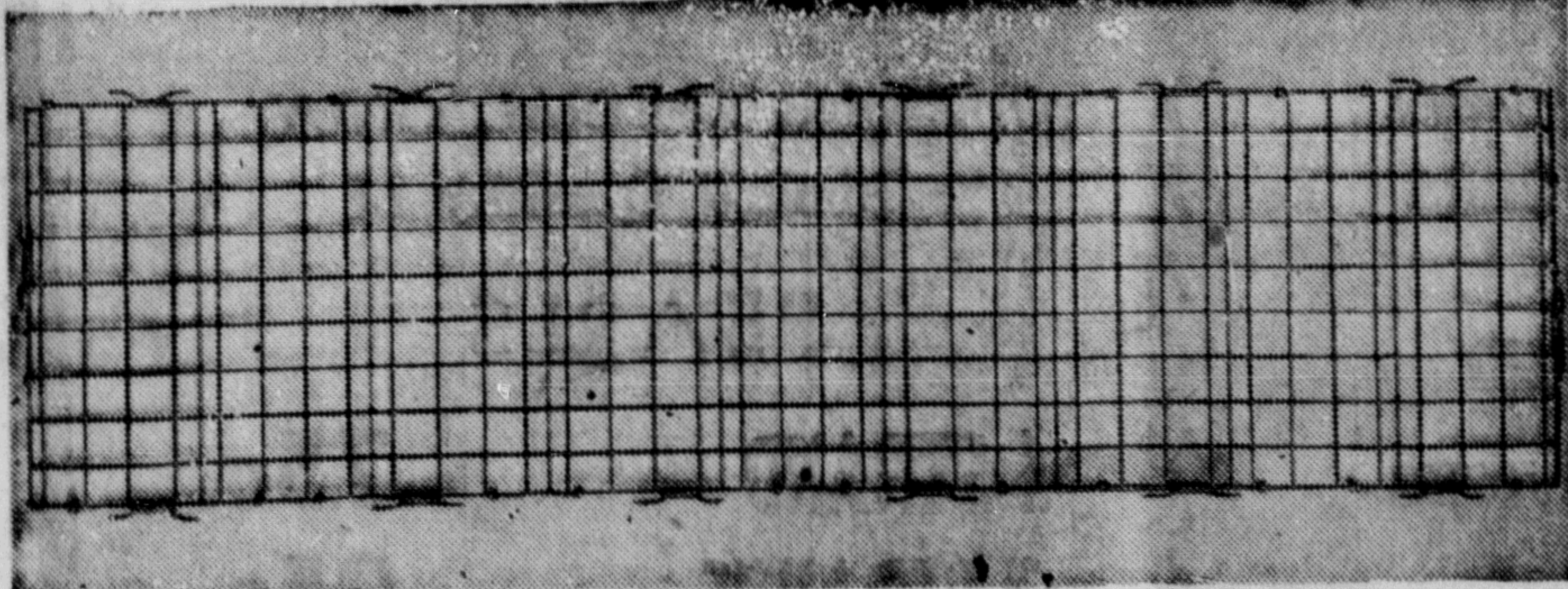
