Gawthrop, director of the regional development division of the provincial Department of Trade and Industry, who was in the city Saturday night returning to Victoria after representing the provincial government at the convention in time.

The index will be distributed by the Department as a reference which it is expected will prove of great value in connection with the development of industrial expansion in British Columbia.
